ENTRY FEES

Entries close 8:00 p.m. Friday, Sept 9, 2016 or when limits are reached. Entries will be accepted that are post-marked or hand delivered by this date.

LISTING FEES

A CKC listing fee of \$9.61 (incl tax) per dog, per class is payable with the entry fee if the entry of the dog does not include a CKC individual Registration Number, ERN, PEN, or Miscellaneous Certificate Number.

NON- MEMBER PARTICIPATION FEE

Effective January 1, 2012:

- a) A non-member participation fee will be charged to a resident of Canada who is a non-member of the CKC. The fee will be \$59.40 plus applicable taxes.
- b) The non-member participation fee is paid in any year a title is earned and covers all titles and dogs owned by that individual.
- c) In order for the title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the nonmember participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in the title being withheld and the dog cannot be moved up to the next level.
- d) The fee applies only to dogs wholly owned by non-member residents of Canada and is not applicable to CKC members.

EVENT REGISTRATION NUMBER

Effective January 1, 1992, all dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will no longer require a CKC registration number but will require an Event Registration Number (ERN). The ERN must be obtained within 30 days of obtaining points, awards or scores to avoid cancellation. An ERN application must be completed and submitted along with a copy of registration documents from a CKC recognized foreign kennel club and the required fee (\$59.40 plus applicable taxes). PERFORMANCE EVENT NUMBER

A Performance Event Number (PEN) allows an unregisterable dog of a CKC breed to participate in competitive events that are appropriate for the breed. To apply for a PEN you must complete a CKC PEN application and forward it with the appropriate fee to the CKC (\$53.90 plus applicable taxes).

Note: A dog that is eligible for a PEN number may not be entered as a listed dog.

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible to compete in these trials, a dog must be at least 6 months of age and registered with the CKC, be eligible for registration with the CKC, have an ERN, PEN, or CKC Miscellaneous Certificate. Spayed bitches, debarked dogs, and neutered males are eligible to participate. Bitches when in season are permitted to compete in the trial. They will be run at the end, at the judge's discretion.

ENTRY INFORMATION

No entry will be accepted unless all particulars requested on the Entry Form is completed in full. Handlers or Agents please note that the full name and address of all owners must be filled in. **Incomplete entries will be returned.** No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by the entry fees. Telephone & telegraph entries cannot be accepted. Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom the entries were made.

Alterations, substitutions, or cancellations of any entry after the closing date is prohibited, except move ups. Only dogs, which are already registered in the CKC Stud Book, or are eligible for such registration, can be entered. The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry subject to CKC rules.

Confirmation Letters and judging schedules will be sent by email, fax, or regular post as soon as possible after the entries close on Friday, Sept 9, 2016.

Tendering of NSF cheques in payment of fees shall be considered non-payment of fees and is punishable by disciplinary action. Any NSF cheque will be subject to a \$50.00 service charge.

Courier Entries will be accepted at the Trial Secretary's address. Please sign in the courier's release for "signature not required".

FOREIGN EXHIBITORS

Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please do not mark personal cheques "payable in Canadian funds" or "at par". The banks will not clear them. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated.

CLASSES

Herding Novice Tested "NT" to be permitted to use the title "Novice Tested" a dog must receive a pass in 2 tests under 2 different judges in a Novice Tested level at approved herding trials Herding Tested "HT" to be permitted to use the title "Herding Tested" a dog must receive a pass in 2 tests under 2 different judges in a Herding Tested level at approved herding trials. Herding Started "HS" to be permitted to use the title "Herding Started" a dog must receive a qualifying score at 3 trials under a minimum of 2 judges in a Herding Started level at approved herding trials.

Herding Intermediate "HI" to be permitted to use the title "Herding Intermediate" a dog must receive a qualifying score at 3 trials under a minimum of 2 judges in a Herding Intermediate level at approved herding trials.

Herding Advanced "HA" to be permitted to use the title "Herding Advanced" a dog must receive a qualifying score at 3 trials under a minimum of 2 judges in a Herding Advanced level at approved herding trials.

As of January 2012, all titles will be followed by (s), (d), or (c) signifying the type of stock the title was earned on.

STOCK

Sheep; 3 - 5 sheep each trial.

ALTERNATES LIST

An "alternates" list will be compiled in the order entries are received. Alternates will be allowed to run in the place of absent dogs if the Trial Secretary is notified preceding the trial of the dogs pending absence. Entry fees for an absent dog replaced by an alternate dog shall be refunded. Alternate dogs, which are not able to run, shall have the entry fees refunded.

MOVE UPS

A dog that is individually registered in the records of the CKC or has an ERN or a Miscellaneous Class Certification Number and has received 2 passing scores under 2 different judges in Novice Tested or Herding Tested, or 3 qualifying scores from at least 2 different judges in Herding Started, or Intermediate, may be transferred to the next level provided that request is received not more than 3 days or less than one hour prior to the commencement of the trial, in accordance with the conditions advertised in the premium list.

Move up forms will be available at the Trial Secretary's table

ROSETTES & RIBBONS

Rosettes will be awarded to High in Trial, Reserve High in Trial, and High Cardigan Corgi in Trial. Rosettes will be awarded to the 1st through 3rd place in each of the following classes: Herding Started, Herding Intermediate, Herding Advanced, and to all dogs receiving a passing score in Novice Tested and Herding Tested.

Dogs MUST have qualifying/passing scores to be eligible for prizes.

Dogs MUST have qualifying scores to be eligible for prizes. All award donations will be acknowledged in the catalogue. All awards must be claimed at the trials, as none will be mailed.

A complete list of donors to the CCCC will be published in the catalogue.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

No provisions will be made for inclement weather. Please bring your own shade, and water for your dogs.

We ask that you keep the grounds clean. Please pick up after you and your dog at the trial site and at your hotel. Any competitor or spectator not doing so may be asked to leave the premises. Please keep your dogs on leash at all times except when they are working in the trial arena.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Trial Secretary will be in full charge of the trials that are governed by CKC rules. The Canadian Cardigan Corgi Club will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume liability in the event of accident, or other misfortunes, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons. If because of riot, civil disturbance or other acts beyond the control of management, it is impossible to open or to complete the show, no refunds of entry will be made.

Dogs need to be ready for judging when called and will be excused when not required for further judging. If a dog is not at the arena after it has been called three times, it will be marked absent. It is the responsibility of the exhibitors to have the dog at ringside when the dog is scheduled for judging. The trial precincts shall consist of all grounds set aside for the use of the CCCC including the area used for parking.

Handlers may not take a training aid of any kind into the arena; either loose or attached to the dog's collar. This includes a whip, PVC pipe, or any other item with the exception of stock stick or shepherd's crook, maximum 1.5 metres (5 ft) in length. It is acceptable for the handler to carry and use a whistle for commanding the dog and to carry the dog's leash. (8.5.1)

Please note: Dogs must be on leash at all times except when working in the ring.

DISCIPLINE

CHAPTER 15 section 15.7 It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, ring steward, volunteer, or competitor at a Herding Trial held under these regulations is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Herding Trial Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. A copy of this regulation shall be prominently placed in every premium list and catalogue.

HERDING TRIAL RULES

The exhibitor is responsible for knowing and complying with the Herding Rules and Regulations of the CKC.

CHAPTER 18, Section 1: The CKC shall not be responsible to any member, person, partnership, club or corporation for any loss, damage or injury arising at or by reason of any herding trial held under any rules adopted by the CKC.

GENERAL RULES

- The Canadian Cardigan Corgi Club will use care and diligence for the welfare of all dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, nor assume liability in the event of an accident or misfortune, however caused, to dogs, exhibitors or property.
- Dogs must be kept under control at all times, and must be kept on leash at all times or crated, except when competing.
- The CKC shall not be responsible to any member, person, partnership, club or corporation for any loss, damage or injury arising at or by reason of any herding test/trial held under any rules adopted by the CKC.
- Only dogs entered in these trials (stock dogs excepted) will be allowed within the precincts of the trial.
- Maximum time allowed for each run will be announced at the handler's meeting. The course design for each class will be posted one hour before the start of the trial.
- Exhibitors will be responsible for picking up after their dogs.
- Water will be available for dogs to cool off in. There is limited shade. Exhibitors are advised to bring their own shade, crates, etc.
- Dogs may be shown on a plain buckle collar or quick release collar.
- Exhibitors must sign the waiver form before being allowed to compete.
- 10. Events will be held rain or shine. Dress for the weather.
- Please make out a separate entry form for each dog, for each class.
