Dogs not registered in Canada must obtain a TCN before submitting an entry for a field trial. TCN's can be obtained from the CKC online, by paper application, or by contacting the Show & Trials division, toll free at 1-855-364-7252. A TCN fee of \$10.50 must be included with your entry for the trial.

CKC Registration of ERN must be applied for within 30 days of the trial or all awards will be cancelled. Refunds must be requested in writing and must be accompanied by a veterinarian's certificate. Make all fees payable to the **BCAFTC.**

Please note: New CKC ruling: Canadian Resident non CKC Members running a wholly owned dog cannot win a placement unless they pay a non-member participation fee or a membership fee to the CKC.

Dead ducks or pheasants will be used. Males and females will be run in order of the draw. Starting dog in the All Age Stakes will be determined by the TSX closing on Wednesday, June 29th, 2022. A system of rotation may be used for the start of subsequent series in all stakes. Female dogs will not be vetted and handlers are reminded that bitches in estrus cannot compete in a CKC Licensed Trial.

CKC Rules and Regulations 21.7

It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules, is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Retriever Field Trial Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

Trial Headquarters will be at the trial. A map will be posted. Daily locations will be signed and catalogues will be available at the stake.
