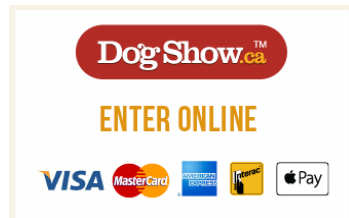

COVID RULES AND INFORMATION

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING ENTERING THIS SHOW!

By submitting entries to this show you are declaring that you agree to the following strictly enforced rules and regulations. Please do not enter this show if you have personal or political reasons for not respecting what we must do to abide by the Alberta Government Covid-19 protocols to keep us all safe.

1. Execution of the show is contingent on the Camrose area of Alberta moving to stage 3 of the Alberta COVID reopening plan that allows ADULT SPORTS and we are allowed to compete in the numbers expressed in the catalogue. Unfettered provincial, interprovincial and international travel is not a prerequisite for operating the show, and refunds will not be considered if you cannot travel to the show due to a restriction on travel.
2. MASKS will be mandatory at all times in the building and must be worn properly. Masks must be worn in the ring. **Face shields, neck warmers, masks with exhalation valves, handkerchiefs and any other loose fitting contraption are NOT masks.** If you do not bring a mask, one will be provided for you.
3. PARKING will be different. **PERFORMANCE exhibitors should park in the FRONT lot** and only use the doors at the main entrance for entrance/exit. **CONFORMATION exhibitors should park in the BACK parking lot** and only use the doors on the west and south walls for entrance/exit. The north and west doors will have Screening Booths. Washrooms and hand sanitizing stations will be provided in the parking lot.
4. CMOH Order [05-2020](#) legally obligates any person who has the following core symptoms of cough, fever, shortness of breath, runny nose, or sore throat (that is not related to a pre-existing illness or health condition) to be in isolation for 10 days from the start of symptoms, or until symptoms resolve, whichever takes longer, or they receive a negative COVID-19 test. If they are exhibiting any of these symptoms, it is suggested they complete the [COVID-19 Self-Assessment online tool](#) to determine if they should be tested. If you exhibit any of these symptoms or the symptoms on the COVID Assessment Tool, you will NOT be allowed to attend the show.
5. The BRCA COVID waiver can be submitted and the COVID Assessment Tool for that day undertaken anytime you are in the parking lot. When you arrive for the first time, please fill out the WAIVER at the end of this Premium List and bring it to the Screening Booth. Look for the SCREENING booths at the main north entrance for performance events and along the west wall for conformation events. Don't wait until just before you show your dog to get your wristband.
6. EACH DAY before you enter the building you will fill out the COVID Assessment Tool at the end of this Premium List and bring it to the Screening Booth. Upon acceptance, a wristband will be placed on your wrist. The wristband is good for that day only.
7. Upon EACH entry into the building, you will need to show your wristband before you can enter the show. We reserve the right to deny entry to anyone without a wristband.
8. Each exhibitor will receive a maximum of ONE wristband only per entry. Due to COVID protocols, there will be a maximum number of people allowed in the building at one time. NO replacement wrist bands will be issued.
9. Violation of any rule may result in your entries for the weekend being cancelled with NO refund of entries.

10. For this show we are only using the MAIN ARENA for all the shows. Obedience will have more space. Conformation will only have two rings. The building will be split with a curtain to keep it a little quieter for the performance dogs and separate people better. The show secretary tables will be in a different location.
11. You will not be able to eat in the building. The concession will not be operating. Food trucks and picnic tables may be available in the parking lot. Please eat outside.
12. Maintain SOCIAL DISTANCING. The venue is huge without the benching. This should not be a problem. We are providing extra space in the rings to maintain these distances. We are marking the ring mats so you don't encroach upon the person in front of you.
13. Exhibitors should arrive on the grounds **ONE HOUR before their scheduled show time for screening. Once screened, stay in your car until 15 minutes before your breed time for showing. The screening doors will be open one hour before show time.**
14. Exhibitors are required to stay outside of the building until just before your breed goes in the ring. The judging schedule will have specific times for each breed. Your breed will be allowed in the show 15 MINUTES before its judging time. Once you have finished showing your breed, please leave the building promptly if you have no other dogs to show in the immediate future. You may then return 15 minutes before your next breed or Group judging, etc.
15. There will be NO BENCHING in the show building. Please do your grooming either outside or before coming to the venue. If you are showing more than one dog you may bring a crate/s in to hold your conflicting dogs, but must take them out when your breed judging is done. NO X-pens. NO floor mats. NO tables. The wash bay will only be available for emergency bathing, but you will have to go outside to dry your dog. Absolutely no dryers inside the building. You may pop up a tent outside beside your car if you need to for grooming etc.
16. The building will be thoroughly CLEANED each night and anything left behind will be removed. Tables and other touch surfaces will be cleaned regularly throughout the day. There will be no chairs at ringside.
17. REFUND POLICY: If we are required to CANCEL the show due to any Alberta Government, City of Camrose or Canadian Kennel Club guidelines, policies or directives, or not moving into stage 3 as outlined in paragraph 1 above, a partial refund (based upon our unrecoverable costs) of entries will be considered. In the event of any refunds; credit card and Dogshow.ca charges will not be refunded. If you are refused entry because you do not pass the COVID Assessment Tool you will not be given a refund. Have a spare handler available.
18. If you are unable to attend due to COVID or any other ailment, it is your responsibility to find an alternative handler for your dog.
19. There will NOT be a PHOTOGRAPHER at this show. We'll put up a ramp that you can use to take your own photos. Judges are NOT allowed to take photos with you.



GENERAL RULES AND INFORMATION

A full description of all ***Conformation, Obedience and Rally Classes*** and ***Rules and Regulations*** can be found at www.ckc.ca

1. This show is held INDOORS at the Camrose Regional Exhibition Grounds (4250 Exhibition Drive, Camrose, Alberta)
2. This is a LIMITED entry dog show. 200 conformation entries. The number of dogs entered in performance judging will be based upon the time limit for one judge.
3. DAY OF TRIAL ENTRIES are only permitted for performance events at this show if there is room. All entries must be in the Show Secretary's hands by the closing date on the front page of this Premium List.
4. MIXED BREEDS are allowed in the performance events with CCN.
5. RALLY-OBEDIENCE will be held in a 40' x 60' Ring.
6. It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to INDIGNITIES. The Conformation Show or Trial Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. A copy of this regulation shall be prominently placed in every premium list and catalogue. (19.7 CKC Conformation Show and 20.7 CKC Obedience and Rally-Obedience Trial Rules and Regulations.)
7. ENTRY FEES WILL NOT BE REFUNDED AFTER CLOSING DATE in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by a veterinarian or judge, or barred from competition by an act of the event club or because it has been entered incorrectly, except as provided in 8 below. Nor will entry fees be refunded if due to riot, civil disturbance or other acts beyond the control of the BRCA, that make it impossible to open or complete the show.
8. ENTRY FEES WILL BE REFUNDED WHEN A BITCH ENTERED INTO THE OBEDIENCE OR RALLY SHOW COMES INTO SEASON within 10 days of the show. A veterinary letter certifying that the bitch came into season within 10 days prior to the show must be delivered to the Show Secretary prior to the commencement of that trial's judging.
9. NON-MEMBER PARTICIPATION FEE:
 - a) An annual non-member fee for awards and titles will be charged to a Canadian non-member of CKC. The fee will match the ERN fee.
 - b) In order to protect the awards/titles earned, the non-member will have a choice either to become a CKC member or pay the non-member fee.
 - c) These fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by non-members of the CKC.
10. The show building will be OPEN at 7:30 am each day. The screening booths will be open at 7:00 am each day.
11. The show building will be LOCKED after the last event of the day.
12. All EMPTY rings are to be kept free of dogs one hour before the show and during the show.
13. Entries will be ACKNOWLEDGED after the closing date. Judging schedule and receipts available online or by mail.

14. Dogs must be EXERCISED in designated areas only. If you exercise outside you must clean up after your dog.
15. All dogs in the show building must be ENTERED in the show. No “IN TRANSIT” dogs will be allowed in the building.
16. All entries must be CLEARLY filled out. The BRCA or the Show Secretary will not correct incorrect entries.
17. SIGNS advertising puppies or other services will not be permitted in the building.
18. **ERN NOTICE:** All dogs that are foreign born and owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will require an ERN. An ERN must be obtained within 30 days of obtaining points, awards or scores to avoid cancellation. If factors beyond your control prohibit this or present a problem, please send a written request for a 30 day extension to the CKC. An ERN may be obtained by contacting the CKC at: (416) 675 -5511 or Fax (416) 675 -6506
19. **BRCA has a zero tolerance** of abuse of any description involving any person involved with the BRCA shows, including spectators.

MOTION:

“THAT, the following be in place to allow clubs flexibility with their judging panels due to government COVID-19 regulations when every reasonable effort has been made to fulfill the judging panel with licensed or permit judges.

This is a temporary alteration to normal judge approval practices.

Exceptions will be permitted under the following circumstances where local guidelines limits the choice of judges to a region and no judges are available.

This includes circumstances where the guidelines change prior to the beginning of the show where judges can no longer officiate.

The club may obtain Shows & Trials Approval to allow permit judges to judge beyond their approved groups.

The club may also seek Shows and Trials approval to select as a Judge a CKC member who must meet following criteria:

- 1) Has attended Judges 101 course
- 2) Has a minimum of 10 years experience as an exhibitor or handler
- 3) Has acted as a Ring steward within the past 3 years
- 4) The breeds and/or groups to be judged should be aligned to their breeding or handling experience.

In the unlikely event that there is no individual who meets the above criteria, the club will be required to provide a short biography of the selected person to Shows and Trials for consideration.

These assignments will not count towards any future credit for assignments.”

REGULAR CLASSES OFFERED

CONFORMATION: The following classes will be provided, divided by sex.

REGULAR CLASSES

JUNIOR PUPPY - 6 months & under 9 months on the day of the show

SENIOR PUPPY- 9 months & under 12 months on the day of the show

CANADIAN BRED - for dogs born in Canada, Champions in any country excluded.

12 – 18 MONTH CLASS 12 months and under 18 months on the day of the show.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR - shall be for dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder.

OPEN CLASS - shall be for all Dogs.

SPECIALS ONLY - This class will NOT be divided by sex. A dog may be entered for “Specials Only” and such dog shall compete for Best of Breed award. If eligible it must compete for the award of Best of Opposite Sex. All awards the dog earned at the show will be cancelled if, at the time of closing of entries for the show, the dog was not registered individually in the records of the Canadian Kennel Club or if the dog has not earned all the championship points required for championship status. The entry of a Listed Dog in this class is NOT allowed.

EXHIBITION ONLY - Dogs entered in this class may not compete in the regular breed classes.

OBEDIENCE CLASSES:

No dog may be entered in both Novice “A” and Novice “B”, Open “A” and Open “B” at the same trial. In determining class eligibility, if a dog shall have won a particular title before being entered or moved up, the handler shall have been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores for the required title. (However, a dog may continue to be exhibited for 60 days in a class after winning a particular title.)

Dogs fulfilling the requirements for a title may be moved to the next level of competition if the schedule permits. The transfer must be on the appropriate move-up form and submitted to the show secretary at least 15 minutes before the start of the class.

PRE-NOVICE - The Pre-Novice class is an elective class and earning the title is not a requirement to enter Novice classes. The Pre-Novice class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of P.C.D. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 5 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercise. Only dogs that have not earned the title of C.D. may enter the Pre-Novice class.

NOVICE A - The Novice A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of C.D. Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. No person who has trained or exhibited a dog that earned a C.D.X. title shall be allowed to handle a dog in this class.

NOVICE B - The Novice B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has not earned the title of C.D. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. The owner or any other person may handle a dog in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises.

NOVICE C - The Novice C class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title C.D. or any higher obedience titles. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises unless he has 2 or

more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises. Dogs may compete in Novice C indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs in the Novice C class are not eligible for High In Trial and do not qualify a dog for any title. Dogs may be entered in the Novice C class in addition to any other official or unofficial classes for which they are eligible.

NOVICE INTERMEDIATE - The Novice Intermediate class is an elective class and earning this title is not a requirement to enter the Open classes. The Novice Intermediate class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned a C.D. or any higher obedience trial titles. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle the dog in all 6 exercises. Dogs may compete in the Novice Intermediate class indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs competing in this class are not eligible for High in Trial. Dogs may be entered in the Novice Intermediate class in addition to any other official or unofficial classes for which they are eligible.

OPEN HA - The Open HA class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of C.D. but has not earned the title of C.D.X. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or member of their immediate families. Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. Any person who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a U.D. title may not handle a dog in this class. Group exercises in Open HA are out of site as before in the original open classes.

Open18A -The requirements are the same as Open HA and the same rules except the Long Sit is replaced with Change of Positions Exercises and the Long Down is replaced with a Group Sit-Walk around.

OPEN HB - The Open HB class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of C.D. Dogs which have earned the title of C.D.X. or any higher titles may enter in the Open B class. A dog may also be entered in the Utility Class in the same trial. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter or handle more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 7 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will choose which of the six numbered routines is to be performed. This choice will not be disclosed to the exhibitors until it is posted at ring side at least 30 minutes before the start of the class. In future assignments, judges are required to alternate the six routines so that each set will be used approximately the same number of times. Group exercises in Open HB are out of site as before in the original open classes .

Open 18B – The requirements are the same as Open HB and the same rules apply except the addition of the new Change of Positions Exercises. As described in the Open HA and Open 18A classes

UTILITY A - The Utility A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of C.D.X. but has not earned the title of U.D. Any person who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a M.O.T.Ch. title may not handle dogs in this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner or member of their immediate families. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises.

UTILITY B - The Utility B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed which has earned the title of C.D.X. or U.D. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will choose which of the six numbered routines will be performed. This choice will not be disclosed to exhibitors until it is posted at ring side at least 30 minutes before the start of the class. In future assignments, judges are required to alternate the six routines so that each will be used approximately the same number of times

RALLY OBEDIENCE CLASSES

- Rally Ring size will be 40' x 60'
- The precincts of these trials are the ring and immediate area surrounding
- Only dogs entered are permitted within the precincts of the trial.
- Order of judging will be determined at the close of entries.

The following classes will be offered in each Rally Obedience trial: Rally Novice A, Rally Novice B, Rally Intermediate, Rally Advanced A, Rally Advanced, B, Rally Excellent A, Rally Excellent B, Rally Master

RALLY NOVICE A:

Dogs competing in this class may not have earned the R. N. title or any CKC Obedience title other than P.C.D. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC C.D.X. title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged on leash, and all dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

RALLY NOVICE B:

Any dog may compete in this class until a qualifying score in the Rally Advanced Class is earned. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged on leash, and all dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

RALLY INTERMEDIATE:

The Rally Intermediate Class is an elective class and earning the title is not a requirement to enter Rally Advanced Classes.(CKC rules, 10.1.2) This class shall be for dogs that have earned the R.N. title. A dog completing the R.I. or any other obedience or rally titles may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. This class (performed on leash, no jumps, no A or B division) may be entered indefinitely. Judges would ordinarily use the same course for it as for their Advanced Classes, substituting one other exercise for the jump required in Advanced

RALLY ADVANCED A:

This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Novice (R. N.) title but have not won the Rally Advanced (R. A.) title or any CKC Novice Obedience title. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class. However, a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has won the title. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

RALLY ADVANCED B:

This class will be for dogs that have earned the R.N. title. A dog completing the R.A. title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged off leash. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash. No dog may be entered in both Rally Advanced A and Rally Advanced B at any one trial.

RALLY EXCELLENT A:

This class shall be for dogs that have earned the R. A. title, but have not earned the R. E. title or any CKC Obedience title other than P.C.D. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC C.D.X. title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged off leash. There is also a sit stay exercise after the finish sign. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

RALLY EXCELLENT B:

This class will be for dogs that have earned the R.A. title. A dog completing the R.E. title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged off leash. There is a sit stay exercise after the finish sign.

RALLY MASTER- This class will be for dogs that have earned the R.E. TITLE . A dog completing the R.M. title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class.. A person may enter more than one dog in this class

All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

No dog may be entered in both Rally Excellent A and Rally Excellent B at any one trial.

No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC Obedience CDX title shall be eligible to enter the A class in Rally Novice, Advanced or Excellent.

COVID-19 Obedience and Rally Rules - General Guidelines

(Copied directly from CKC Covid guidelines)

Clubs will follow all Federal, Provincial and local health rules when holding a trial and the protocol will be detailed in the Premium List. Judges, officials, and handlers will abide by the rules specified.

The following are allowable temporary changes to the Obedience Rules and Regulations that a club may opt to use during their event while operation under COVID restrictions. However any other changes to any other rule not mentioned here will not be allowed.

- Judges may wear a mask even if not required by the club
- The chair or table where the leash and other equipment is to be placed should be located at a convenient place determined by the judge but can be located in the ring or if not appropriate, just outside of the ring such that the handler can obtain the item without leaving the ring
- If a chair or table or any other surface is used to hold leashes, dumbbells, gloves or any other equipment owned by the handler, that surface must be sanitized immediately after use. Paper can be placed on the surface if sanitizing is not done but that paper must be removed immediately after use, disposed of appropriately and replaced ready for the next exhibitor
- If a re-throw of the dumbbell is required, the handler should be allowed to ask the dog to stay and the handler will go and pick up the dumbbell and return to where the dog was left. If the dog moves during this process, it will not be judged unless it is out of control
- For the article exercise in Utility, the handler can retrieve the articles to be scented from the article bag and put them on the 'article' chair
- Score sheets should not be given out to competitors in the ring, but the club may pass the scoresheet information on to the competitors electronically or some other 'touch free' means
- In the Rally Advanced Class, the handler can put the leash in their pocket or hang it around the neck as in the Pre-Novice recall
- The exhibitor may either leave the dog on a sit stay or heel with the dog to the location of the chair to both obtain and return their leash and articles used during the exercises.
- It is recommended that the club publish either in the premium list or judging schedule or both, the modified rules that it is adopting for their event.

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points.

15.1.8 In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Best of Breed which also places in the regular Group competition shall be credited with the following additional points provided that a dog was defeated at the Group level.

Grand Champion (GCh) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship. To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Points towards the Grand Champion title, at breed level, are awarded to the Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level
