ENTRIES AND FEES

Entry Fees: Junior Hunter: \$50.00 per dog / day

Senior Hunter: \$ 65.00 per dog / day Master Hunter: \$ 75.00 per dog / day

Online entry via www.dogshow.ca, from 8:00pm on Thursday August 15th.



A service charge of 5% will be assessed. This includes entries sent online, by fax or post using a credit card or interac for payment.

Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom the errors were made. The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry subject to CKC rules. Any NSF cheques will be subject to a \$30.00 service charge. Entry fee plus service charge for NSF cheques must be paid in cash prior to test.

Bitches in season will not be permitted on test grounds. Entry fees will be refunded when a veterinarian's certificate is presented before the start of the test.

Note: All owners of <u>unregistered</u>, CKC-recognized breeds entering events are required to obtain a Temporary Competition Number (TCN). TCNs replaced the previous system of entering events with dogs as "listed", and allow dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN). A TCN must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event. The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered or has an ERN. A TCN cannot be used for Listed Breeds with an MCN (Miscellaneous Competition Number) or dogs that will require a PEN (Performance Event Number) or CCN (Canine Companion Number).

TCNs can be obtained:

- Online through CKC Portal (Note individuals who have not yet used the online Portal will be required to create a Portal account before they can submit a TCN application online), or
- By submitting a completed paper application by mail to CKC or by contacting the Shows and Trials Division, toll free.

RUNNING ORDER AND GAME

Running order will be determined by draw after closing. When multiple entries are received with the same handler, dogs will be separated in the running order where possible.

Running orders and test site locations, plus a digital copy of the catalogue will be emailed or otherwise made available to participants after closing.

Printed copies of the running order will be available on site, but copies of catalogues will not (please print and bring your own, if desired).

Ducks will be used for the land and water series of the tests.

ROSETTES

Rosettes will be presented to dog / handler teams passing the test at the end of each day.

TAILGATE / BBQ

There will be a tailgate / BBQ at HQ shortly after the conclusion of the tests on Saturday. Please bring cash.

CANADIAN NATIONAL MASTER RETRIEVER CLUB

Lanark Highlands Retriever Club is a member in good standing of the Canadian National Master Retriever Club. Only passes at Hunt Tests hosted by clubs in good standing of the Canadian National Master Retriever Club are considered in determining eligibility to enter the National Master Hunt Test Stake.

OTHER INFORMATION

- Replica shotguns will be used during the test. Handlers at SH and MH levels will be required to handle a replica shotgun during the test, and handlers in JH may be asked to carry a replica shotgun to the running line once. At all levels the gun/replica shall be treated as though it is a real firearm. Gun safety is paramount, and unsafe gun handling can result in the handler's removal from the test.
- All participants and spectators must wear dark or camouflage clothing.
- Puppies: All dogs must be at least 6 months of age on the day of the test.
- Refunds will be given for bitches in season or dogs determined by a veterinarian to be unfit to compete. A Veterinarian Certificate must be submitted before the start of the test.
- CKC Hunt Test rules state that there shall be no training of dogs on the grounds of a hunt test, except for single training bumpers which are thrown by hand by the handler, either within 24 hours of the commencement of the event, or at any time during the event.
- CKC Hunt Test rules state that electronic collars (either dummy or live) as well as prong or pinch type collars shall not be worn by a dog on the grounds of a Hunt Test at any time during the event with the exception of those collars designed to curb barking which may be worn by a dog while kenneled.
- The marshal is in control of the stake. Do not approach the judges directly. Ask questions during the handler's meeting at the start of each test. Otherwise, direct inquiries through the marshal.
- Handlers are advised that they may be asked to operate a gun station when they are not running. Please help if asked to facilitate the smooth running of the test.
- No meals, drinks, or snacks will be available on site. Please bring your own.
- Please respect the landowners that have so graciously allowed us on their land by obeying all signage or directions and removing all garbage and debris. Close all gates and park ONLY where advised.

HEALTH OF DOGS ON THE PREMISES OF EVENTS

As per CKC rules, no dog may be brought onto the grounds of an event if it:

- Is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.
- Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease within the last 30 days (prior to the event);
- Has been housed within 30 days prior to the event on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.

Clubs have the right to remove a dog from the event premises and the exhibitor may be subject to disciplinary action if it is found that CKC rules have been contravened.

CKC NON-MEMBER PARTICIPATION

The Non-Member Participation fee applies to dogs wholly owned by a resident of Canada who is not a member of the CKC. It is not applicable to CKC members or dogs owned with a CKC member. In order for the title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the Non-Member Participation Fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in the title being withheld and the dog cannot be moved up to the next level. (For a Membership application, please go to www.ckc.ca under CKC Services and Forms On-Line). The Non-Member Participation Fee is paid in the calendar year (January-December) in which the dog achieved its title and/or titles.

INDIGNITIES

CKC's Hunt Test Rules & Regulations state "It shall be the duty and obligation of the event-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at a hunt test held under these regulations, is not subject to any indignities. The Hunt Test Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. A copy of this regulation shall be prominently placed in every premium list and catalogue."
