All dogs entered in any UNOFFICIAL CLASS must be entered in a regular trial the same day or as exhibition only.

The Windsor All Breed Training & Tracking Club will offer the following at each Rally Obedience Trial:

First in each Class - rosette

Second to Fourth in each Class – flat ribbon

WABTTC will offer new title rosettes.

Rally Team Novice

Rally Team is open to any four dogs that have earned a title of RN or higher. Each team member will run the course individually, with the team time running continuously. The judge will give the first member of the team the "Forward" command from the Start sign. Each subsequent dog and handler will start when the previous dog and handler pass the Finish sign, without any additional command of "Forward" by the judge. Timing for each team will begin when the judge commands "Forward" to the first handler in the team and will stop when the fourth handler and dog pass the finish line. Scores will be based on a possible score of 400 points for each team, with ties being broken by time. Each dog and handler will be scored as in official classes. A qualifying score is 280 points or more.

Rally Teams Novice will be held after the 2nd Rally trail on Saturday November 16, 2024.

Team Prizes: 1st place, a rosette and a dog toy for each team member, 2nd-4th a flat.

Please consider entering before the closing date as it helps the club plan better!

If you want to enter Rally Team, but do not have a full team, please email Jen Dinchik at loon8080@gmail.com and we can do our best to find a team for you! Ideally, everyone entering at least 1 trial, that has their RN title would enter the team events.

Obedience Wildcard Classes

No title is required for entry in any Wild Card class, but any dog entered must be capable of performing the exercises required for at the class level in which it is entered. Handlers may use verbal encouragement and praise during exercises in these classes without penalty. Handlers may also use additional commands but will be penalized accordingly.

The Wild Card option: A handler may choose to perform all exercises in a class, in which case all will be scored, or a handler may choose to skip one exercise and receive full credit for that exercise. The handler must inform the judge which exercise will be skipped before beginning the exercises. If an exercise is chosen to be skipped, it may not be performed. (For example, a handler may choose to omit the Stand for Examination in Novice, the Group Down in Open or the Directed Jumping in Utility and receive a perfect score for the exercise.)

Wild Card Novice class. Any dog that is capable of performing the Novice class exercises may be entered in the Wild Card Novice class, which will be performed and judged as the regular Novice class. 16.2.7

Wild Card Open class. Any dog that is capable of performing the Open class exercises may be entered in the Wild Card Open class, which will be performed and judged as the regular Open A class.

Wild Card Utility class. Any dog that is capable of performing the Utility class exercises may be entered in the Wild Card Utility class, which will be performed and judged as the regular Utility A class. Handlers are permitted to encourage and praise their dogs verbally during the performance of all Utility exercises except the signal exercise.

General Trial & Site Information

The venue is a beautiful 10,000 ft² gymnasium with covered floor and rubber matting in the rings. There is ample room for crating, and crates & chairs may be left overnight in the building. Handlers may set up Friday night between 4 and 9pm. No dogs are to be left in the building overnight.

WABTTC will be participating in a "Mo-vember" Fundraiser to raise awareness and funds for men's health. The trial is being hosted by "Mo-Sister's" Club Members and "Mo-Sister's" Judging Panel. WABTTC will donate 50% of proceeds collected from the trial's fundraisers, raffles, and donations to the Prostate Cancer Foundation Canada in memory of all those loved who have been affected by men's cancer.

WABTTC would like to encourage trial exhibitors to consider supporting our Mo-vember fundraiser by donating new or gently used items to our raffles.

In consideration of the acceptance of this entry I (we) agree to be bound by the rules and regulations of the Canadian Kennel Club and by any additional rules and regulations appearing in the premium list. Also by signing this form, I certify that I will not hold the Show giving Club, its members, directors, employees or agents liable in the event of any accident of misfortune however caused.

Entry Information

- 1. No entry will be accepted unless all particulars called for on the entry form are completed in full.
- 2. Incomplete entries will be returned. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by entry fees. Telephone/fax entries are accepted by The Entry Line at 1-800-293-2935; (fax) 519-754-0796. Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom the entries were made.
- Alterations, substitution or cancellation of any entry after the closing date is prohibited. ENTRIES POSITIVELY CLOSE THURSDAY, OCTOBER 31, 2024, AT 8:00 PM, OR WHEN THE ENTRY LIMIT IS REACHED, WHICHEVER OCCURS FIRST.
- 4. Identification cards and judging schedules will be sent as soon as possible after the entries close. Identification cards must be presented to the Trial Secretary upon arrival at the trial.
- Tendering of an NSF cheque in payment of fees shall be considered non-payment of fees and is punishable by disciplinary action. Any NSF cheque will be subject to a \$30 service charge.

General Information

- 1. The Trial Secretary will be in full charge of the trial, which will be governed by CKC rules.
- 2. The Windsor All Breed Training & Tracking Club will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume liability, in the event of accident or other misfortunes, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
- 3. If, because of riot, civil disturbance, or other acts beyond the control of management, it is impossible to open or complete the trials, no refund of entry will be made.
- 4. The trial precincts shall be the entire building of Windsor All Breed Training & Tracking Club.

Indignities to a Judge, Official or Exhibitor

Section 20.7 It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, ring steward, volunteer or competitor at an obedience or obedience rally trial held under these regulations is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Trial Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

Limited Entry

OBEDIENCE: Entry in each obedience trial will be limited to the capacity of the judge to judge at the rate of 9 Pre-Novice, 8 Novice and Novice Intermediate, 7 Open, and 6 Utility dogs per hour. A judge may not be assigned more than 7 hours of judging.

RALLY: Entry in each rally obedience trial will be limited to the capacity of the judge to judge at the rate of 15 dogs per hour less time for walkthroughs. A judge may not be assigned more than 7 hours of judging.

Once a judge has reached his/her capacity, entries for that trial will be closed even if the closing date has not been reached. In the case of the entry limit having been reached, remaining entries will be assigned a position (by class) on a reserve list. Exhibitors will be notified of their position on the reserve list. If the entry of a bitch in season is pulled after entries are closed, it may be substituted with one from the reserve list up to and including the day of the trial. If the entry of another dog is pulled prior to the trial, it may be substituted with one from the reserve list up to 24 hours prior to the trial.

Mixed & Unrecognized Breeds

These trials are open to mixed and unrecognized breeds. In order to compete, mixed and unrecognized breed dogs must have a Canine Companion Number (CCN) from the Canadian Kennel Club and must have a CKC-approved microchip. Mixed-breed dogs must be spayed or neutered.

Unrecognized breed dogs do not need to be spayed or neutered. A dog eligible for a CCN may not be entered as a listed dog.

Bitches in Season

Bitches in season are not permitted to compete. When a bitch comes into season after entries close, a Veterinarian's Certificate, certifying that the bitch was in season within ten (10) days of the trial, must reach the Trial Secretary on or before the day of the trial, prior to the judging of the class, and the club will refund the entry fees.

Moving Up

Section 6.9.1 A dog that is registered in the records of the CKC with an eligible number according to these rules and has fulfilled the requirements for a title in accordance with these rules may be moved to the next level of competition if the schedule permits. The transfer must be on the appropriate move-up form and submitted to the trial secretary by the owner or handler at least 30 minutes before the start of the trial.

Section 6.9.3 The Trial Secretary shall amend the judge's book and the marked catalogue, which is to be sent to the CKC with the requests attached to the appropriate entry forms.

Section 6.9.5 In order for a dog to be eligible to move up, the dog must be individually registered with the CKC, have a Performance Event Number (PEN), or an Event Registration Number (ERN) before entries close. The addition of a CKC number after close of entries does not make the dog eligible and will result in referral to the Discipline Committee.

Temporary Competition Number (TCN)

A Temporary Competition Number (TCN) allows dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN). A TCN must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event. The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered or has an ERN.

A TCN cannot be used for dogs that require a PEN or a CCN number.

Note: There is no CKC fee to obtain a TCN. However, a TCN 'listing' fee is required each time a dog with only a TCN is entered in an event.

Event Registration Number (ERN)

All dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events, and do not have a CKC registration number, will require an Event Registration Number (ERN).

The ERN number MUST be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event.

Performance Event Number (PEN)

A Performance Event Number (PEN) allows a non-registrable dog of a **CKC-RECOGNIZED BREED** to participate in competitive events that are appropriate for the breed. To be eligible to receive a PEN, all of the following must be met:

- The dog must be of a breed recognized by the CKC (not on the CKC Miscellaneous Class List).
- The dog must not be eligible for CKC registration.
- The dog must be spayed or neutered.
- The dog must be properly identified with a CKC-approved microchip.

A dog that is eligible for a PEN may not be entered as a 'listed' dog.

Canine Companion Number (CCN)

A Canine Companion Number (CCN) allows **UNRECOGNIZED BREEDS** to compete in CKC performance events. To be eligible to receive a CCN, all the following must be met:

Unrecognized Breeds

- The dog must be either an Unrecognized Breed.
- Unrecognized Breeds are not required to be spayed or neutered.
- The dog must be properly identified with a CKC microchip.

A dog that is eligible for a CCN may not be entered as a 'listed' dog.

All the above 'registration' numbers can be obtained:

- Online through CKC's Portal (Note: Individuals who have not yet used the online Portal will be required to create a Portal account before they can submit an application online); or
- By submitting a completed paper application by mail to CKC.

It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, ring steward, volunteer or competitor at an Obedience Trial held under these regulations is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Obedience Trial Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

Obedience Trial Rules and Regulations

The Exhibitor is responsible for knowing and complying with the Obedience Rules and Regulations of the Canadian Kennel Club.

Section 19.7 of the Obedience Rules and Regulations states: It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, ring steward, volunteer, or competitor at an Obedience Trial held under these regulations, is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Obedience Trial Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

Master Obedience Trial Champion (MOTCH)

Section 14.3.1 The CKC will permit the use of the letters MOTCH to be used as a prefix of the name of any dog that has met the requirements for that title as hereinafter provided.

Section 14.3.2 Points for this title may only be accumulated after the completion of the OTCH title.

Section 14.3.3 Points may be accumulated simultaneously with credits toward both the OTCHX and MOTCH titles. However, the MOTCH title will not be awarded until completion of the OTCHX title.

Section 14.3.4 One High in Class placement is required in either of the Open B classes or the Utility B class but no minimum score is required.

Section 14.3.5 A dog must acquire a total of 40 points to earn a MOTCH title. A minimum of 15 points must be obtained from either of the Open B classes and the Utility B class. The remaining 10 points can be obtained from either class.

Rally Obedience Trial Rules and Regulations

The Exhibitor is responsible for knowing and complying with the Rally Obedience Rules and Regulations of the Canadian Kennel Club.

Section 17.7 of the Rally Obedience Rules and Regulations states: It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, ring steward, volunteer or competitor at a rally Obedience Trial held under these regulations, is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Trial Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

Rally Champion (RCH)

Section 16.1 The CKC will permit the use of the letters RCH to be used as a prefix of the name of any dog that has met the requirements for that title as hereinafter provided.

Section 16.2 A dog may begin earning points toward the RCH title as soon as the Rally Master (RM) title requirements have been completed.

Section 16.3 The RCH title will be awarded to dogs that have successfully earned a minimum of 100 points total from competing in both the Excellent B and Master classes in the same trial.

- (a) 50 points must come from the Rally Excellent B class, including a minimum of five (5) scores of 95 or higher.
- (b) 50 points must come from the Rally Master class, including a minimum of five (5) scores of 95 or higher.

Section 16.4 A qualifying score must be earned in both the Excellent B class and the Master class in the same trial on five (5) different occasions under at least five (5) different judges

BEFORE YOU ENTER A RALLY "A" CLASS!

If the dog you are entering has earned any CKC obedience title other than a PCD (e.g., a CD title or higher), the dog CANNOT be entered in any Rally "A" class.

Handlers who have exhibited any dog to a CKC CDX title CANNOT enter the "A" classes.

Rally Novice A: Handlers who have exhibited any dog to a CKC RA title CANNOT enter the Novice A class.

Rally Advanced A: Handlers who have exhibited any dog to a CKC RE title CANNOT enter the Advanced A class.

Rally Excellent A: Handlers who have exhibited any dog to a CKC RM title CANNOT enter the Excellent A class.

Entering the wrong class will result in the cancellation of legs and titles.

From Windsor: Follow ON-3 E, turn right onto Erie Street N in Leamington. Turn right onto Oak Street, turn left onto Sherk Street and continue to Nature Fresh Farms Recreation Centre.

All dogs must enter from the north side entrance and are only permitted in the gymnasium. Crates and chairs may be left in the building overnight at your own risk.

No dogs may be left in the building overnight.
