Entry Information

- 1. No entry will be accepted unless all particulars called for on the entry form are completed in full. Handlers or agents please note the full name and address of all owners must be filled in.
- Incomplete entries will be returned. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by entry fees. Telephone and telegraph entries cannot be accepted. Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom the entries were made.
- 3. There is no refund for duplicate cheques. Every effort will be made to find all duplicate entries, however if the entry has been processed and appears in the official catalogue, no refund will be made.
- 4. Alterations, substitutions or cancellations of any entry after the closing date is prohibited. Moving Class Dogs to Specials or unfinished Specials back to the classes is permitted. An error in the class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show. Only dogs already registered in the Canadian Kennel Club Stud Book, or eligible for such registration, can be entered. The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry subject to CKC Rules. Entries close 8 P.M. (ET) Wednesday, April 19, 2023, and must be in the hands of the Show Secretary by that date.
- 5. Identification cards and judging schedules will be e-mailed as soon as possible after the entries close.
- 6. Tendering of NSF cheques in payment of fees shall be considered non-payment of fees and is punishable by disciplinary action. **Any NSF cheques will be subject to a \$35 service charge.**

General Information

- 1. The Show Superintendent will be in full charge of the show, which will be governed by CKC Rules.
- 2. The Seaway Kennel Club will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume liability in the event of accident, or other misfortunes, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
- 3. If, because of riot, civil disturbance or other acts beyond the control of management, it is impossible to open or to complete the show, no refund of Entry will be made.
- 4. Dogs should arrive in adequate time for their breed judging (allowing for absentees) and will be excused each show when not required for further judging. It is the responsibility of the exhibitors to have the dog at ringside when the dog's class is scheduled for judging. Waiting for dogs will not be possible and handlers with several breeds must arrange for alternate handlers if judging times for their breeds conflict.
- 5. Judging will commence at 8 a.m. each day. A later starting time may be specified in the judging schedule. Starting time of each ring will be specified in judging schedule.
- 6. SHOW PRECINCTS: The show precincts shall consist of all areas set out for rings, all shelters or facilities set aside for show officials, judges, exhibitors and handlers.

NOTE: The Show Superintendent may restrict the placing of chairs, tables and crates and may limit the use of private exercise pens during show hours.

Refund Policy

If, because of riot, civil disturbance or other acts beyond the control of management, it is impossible to open or to complete the show, no refund of Entry will be made.

Temporary Competition Number (TCN)

A Temporary Competition Number (TCN) allows dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN).

A TCN must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event.

The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered or has an ERN.

TCNs can be obtained through your CKC member portal or by contacting the CKC.

Note: There is no CKC fee to obtain a TCN. However, a TCN 'listing' fee is required each time a dog with only a TCN is entered in an event.

Event Registration Number (ERN)

All dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events, and do not have a CKC registration number, will require an Event Registration Number (ERN).

The ERN number MUST be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event.

Fee is \$64.00 per dog, plus applicable taxes.

Non-Member Participation Fee

Effective January 1, 2011:

- A non-member participation fee will be charged to a resident of Canada who is a non-member of the CKC. The fee will be \$170.00 plus applicable taxes.
- b) The non-member participation fee is paid in any year a title is earned and covers all titles and dogs owned by that individual.
- c) In order for the title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in the title being withheld and the dog cannot be moved up to the next level.
- d) The fee applies only to dogs wholly owned by non-member residents of Canada and is not applicable to CKC members.

MEET OUR JUDGES

Ekarat Sangkunakup, Specialty

Mr. Ekarat Sangkunakup of Thailand, began his involvement with American show dogs in 1982.

Perhaps being best known in the United States for his top winning Chow Chows and Dobermans, he has also had top winning English Pointers, Shih Tzu, Pomeranians, Smooth Fox Terriers, American Cockers, and Golden Retrievers.

The dogs are proudly exhibited under the United prefix, garnering numerous Championships across the world.

The United Chow Chows were the first Thai bred dogs to be shown competitively in the US, and to this day, remain the premier representative of Thailand for their excellent quality, not only in America, but abroad.

Chow Chows bred or owned by Mr. Sangkunakup have amassed over 300 All-Breed Best in Shows, along with over 500 All-Breed Best Baby in Shows worldwide. In addition, over 200 Best in Shows with other breeds owned and shown over the last twenty years.

United Kennels has had more than twenty different dogs hold the #1 position both in the US and Thailand. United Chows have ranked #1 Chow Chow in the breed more than twenty times in Thailand, and have been extremely successful in the United States and across Asia having become the #1 Chow in various countries.

Mr. Sangkunakup is recognized throughout the world for his in-depth knowledge of canine structure and breed type. At the core of his philosophy as a breeder/judge, is the belief that the preservation of the breed standard and type, ultimately depends upon the collaboration and education of dog breeders worldwide. Breeding and judging according to the Chow (or any breed) standard is of the utmost importance in order to maintain the integrity of this historic and beloved breed, promoting continuous education for the purpose of the Preservation Breeder.

Mr. Sangkunakup is the first South East Asian Judge to have judged Nationals in many countries including in the United States and Canada. He is also the first Thai Judge to have judged at the World Dog Show.

Mr Sangkunakup is licensed as an All Breed Judge as follows: Award Challenge Certificates and CACIBS at CC/CACIB at all breed Champion Show levels by The Kennel Club Association of Thailand and FCI International Dog Shows, everywhere dogs are exhibited.

As an all breed judge, he has been judging around the world including in the U.S.A , Canada , South America , Russia , Scandinavian, Australia , New Zealand , Asia as well as his native Thailand .

While actively pursuing his judging career domestically and abroad, he continues to campaign his outstanding Thai bred dogs in the United States.

Pat Robb, Sweepstakes

I owned, showed and bred Chows for 45 to 50 years. I had a couple of Chows growing up and to me that was the only breed for me. When my husband and I started seeing each other, he really liked my Chow Sen Sen and Sen loved him, thank heavens.

A few years after we married we got our first Chow, then a second one was added. Within a few years we had a kennel of 8 to 10 Chows and the registered kennel name, Mi-Tu. Normally we only had 1 or 2 litters per year. I had Chows in the U.S., Canada and France. Many became Champions in Canada and the U.S. Unfortunately, as we grew older, we could no longer manage the number of dogs and large property. We sold the kennel and moved to a house where we had 4 of the older dogs with us. After a few years they passed on and now have no dogs at all. I really miss my Chow kids.

Dogs entered in Veteran Sweepstakes must be entered in a Regular Class or Exhibition Only at this show. Spayed and neutered dogs may compete in Veteran Sweepstakes.

Best in Sweepstakes and Best of Opposite Sex in Sweepstakes will receive a trophy and rosette. Flat ribbons 1st through 4th for each class.

Best in Veteran Sweepstakes and Best of Opposite Sex in Veteran Sweepstakes will receive a trophy and rosette. Flat ribbons 1st through 4th for each class.

Sweepstakes Prize Money

Money received in entry fees shall be divided as follows: 25% of total fees will be retained by the club for administration. Best in Sweepstakes will receive 25% of total entry fee. Best of Opposite Sex in Sweepstakes will receive 20% of total entry fee. First Place winners in each class will divide the remaining 30% of the total entry fee.

Special Events

A dressing room will be assigned for the use of Chow exhibitors.

A light lunch will be provided after the Specialty in the dressing room.

Specialty Classes

(both sexes)

REGULAR CLASSES:

JUNIOR PUPPY – A dog between 6 months and under 9 months on day of show.

SENIOR PUPPY – A dog between 9 months and under 12 months on day of show.

12-18 MONTHS – A dog between 12 months and under 18 months on day of show.

CANADIAN BRED - A dog born in Canada.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR – Dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder. The handler must be the owner/co-owner **AND** breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The breeder/owner must handle the dog in this class, but need not handle the dog for further awards.

OPEN CLASS – For all dogs.

VETERANS CLASS – For all dogs over 7 years of age as of the date of the show. These dogs compete for the regular placements, and the 1st-place dog and bitch will compete for Best of Breed. Veterans may be broken down into separate age categories. The winner of the Veterans Class will not compete for points but go directly into the Best of Breed competition. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered.

ALTERED – Limited to dogs and bitches over 6 months of age that have been sexually altered by veterinarian procedure.

SPECIALS ONLY – Dogs that are Canadian Champions.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES:

BABY PUPPY – A dog between 4 months and under 6 months on day of show. Baby Puppies do not compete for points.

STUD DOG & GET – Stud Dog and two or more of his get. Stud must be entered in a Regular class or Exhibition Only. Get must be entered in a Regular class. Stud Dog may be neutered. Ownership in this class need not be identical.

BROOD BITCH & PROGENY – Brood Bitch and two or more of her progeny. Brood Bitch must be entered in a Regular class or Exhibition Only. Progeny must be entered in a Regular class. Brood Bitch may be spayed. Ownership in this class need not be identical.

EXHIBITION ONLY – All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in Regular competition. Dogs entered in this class may not compete in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular/Unofficial classes and/or Parades.

CH and Champion Points

Section 15.1.1 A dog awarded Winners at a conformation show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the number of championship points credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be as provided hereunder.

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge <u>SHALL NOT</u> be included in the calculation for championship points.

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed, or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above.

Section 15.1.8 In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Best of Breed that also places in the regular group competition shall be credited with the following additional points, provided that a dog was defeated at the group level.

Section 15.1.11 A class dog awarded Best in Show at an all-breed Championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level.

Section 15.1.12 In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion and its owner provided with a Championship Certificate, the dog must have earned 10 championship points under at least three (3) different judges, with at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

GCH and Grand Champion Points

Section 15.2.1 The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship.

15.2.2 Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship.

Section 15.2.3 To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

a) Grand Champion Point System Points towards the Grand Champion title, are attained at breed level and are awarded to Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level for all levels of GCh:

- c) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.
- d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Section 15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB)

The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.
- c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

Section 15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS)

The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Section 15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold (GChG)

The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

- a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.
- b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

GCHEX and Grand Champion Excellent Points

The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

Section 15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

- a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed).
- b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty Best of Breed wins.
- c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

Section 15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

Altered Champion and Altered Points

Section 13.8.1 Championship points will be awarded as per Chapter 15, with the exception of 15.1.11. The winner of an Altered Best in Show shall be awarded points according to the total number of dogs in competition following the point schedule in Section 15.1.2.

Section 15.1.12 In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion [Alt] and its owner provided with a Championship Certificate, the dog must have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

Conformation Show Rules and Regulations

The Exhibitor is responsible for knowing and complying with the Conformation Show Rules and Regulations of the Canadian Kennel Club.

Section 4.7.3 of the Conformation Show Rules and Regulations states: A judge officiating at a show held under these rules shall not be subjected to indignities of any kind during the progress of the show. It shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out.

Moving Class Dog to Specials Only

Section 8.9 of the Conformation Show Rules and Regulations has been amended to allow a dog which is individually registered in the records of the Canadian Kennel Club, and has completed the requirements for a Championship, after the Closing Date for entries for a show, may be transferred from one of the Regular Classes to "Specials Only," providing the request for a transfer is submitted to the Show Secretary in WRITING at least one hour prior to the judging of your breed by the owner or handler.

When one or more all-breed and/or specialty shows are held on the same day, in the same venue, the request for moving of class dogs to Specials Only must be made a minimum of one (1) hour prior to the breed judging scheduled start of the show for which the dog is being moved up to Specials Only.

Moving from Specials Back to the Classes

Section 8.10.5 A dog can be moved back into the classes from a Special if it has been entered incorrectly, only where the shows have already closed.

HEALTH REMINDERS

No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of an event if it:

- 1. Is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease:
- 2. Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease within the last 30 days (prior to the event);
- 3. Has been housed within 30 days prior to the even on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.

Clubs do have the right to remove a dog from the event premises and the exhibitor may be subject to disciplinary action if it is found that CKC rules have been contravened.

Motels / Hotels

There are many Motels within 5 miles of the show site, most of which are on Lundy's Lane in Niagara Falls. Motels request exhibitors to clean up after their dogs on Motel grounds. Owners will be responsible and liable for any damage. Please co-operate, we want the Motels to welcome our exhibitors and their dogs again next year. When making reservations please check if they will accept dogs in the rooms.
