Equipment and course familiarization:

- There will be NO contact equipment familiarization.
- A warm – up area with a single practice jump will be provided for dogs entered in the trials.
- Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, prior to the start of the class

Agility Rules and Regulations: (4.1.3.t) It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules, is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Agility Trial Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit, on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred

There will be Move Ups between Sunday & Monday - no same day move ups

We will try to accommodate those dogs with conflicts in conformation/obedience/rally, but we cannot hold the rings.

Entry Requirements:

Every dog entered in an approved agility trial must be one of the following:

- registered with the CKC
- have a Canine Companion Number
- have an Event Registration Number or a Performance Event Number
- eligible for registration with the CKC or
- have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN) if it belongs to a CKC listed breed

The dog must be at least 18 months of age, may be spayed or neutered. The dog may not be lame or compete if it has tape or bandages.

AGILITY CLASSES OFFERED

The following C.K.C. classes (divided by heights) will be offered:

STANDARD REGULAR CLASS divided into these Levels

Novice Standard: Novice Class is open to any dog that has not earned a Qualifying score in the CKC Intermediate Class. This class is not divided. Novice is for dogs that have not acquired the Novice title and/or have not earned a qualifying score in Agility Intermediate.

Intermediate Standard: The Intermediate class is open to dogs that have acquired the Agility Novice title, and to those dogs which have acquired the Intermediate title but have not yet acquired a qualifying score towards the Excellent title.

Excellent Standard: The Excellent class is for dogs that have acquired the Intermediate title, but have not yet earned the Agility Excellent title.

Master Excellent Standard: The Master Excellent class is for dogs that have acquired the Excellent title or the Master Excellent title.

JUMPERS WITH WEAVES (JWW) CLASS

JWW has the same levels, heights, and conditions as for Standard Regular.

POINTS & DISTANCE (PAD) CLASS ☆NEW CLASS!

PAD is a game of strategy involving distance handling and point accumulation. It is designed to test, skill, accuracy, speed, timing, and distance handling, and to demonstrate a dog's ability to work with its handler over a variety of agility Obstacles.

PAD is divided into the same levels, heights, and has the same conditions as for Standard Regular.

The class is not part of the Agility Master Championship titling program but offers Standalone titles.

STEEPLECHASE CLASS ☆NEW CLASS!

Steeplechase is a fast paced game designed to emphasize speed and control on a jumpers style course which contains the two most dynamic obstacles – the A frame and Weave Poles. The course design requires constant flow and a design that encourages speed throughout the course, while testing the handler's control.

The class is not part of the Agility Master Championship titling program but offers Standalone titles.

There are no Levels in Steeplechase.

The Regular Class Division is described above. The other two Class Divisions available are:

SELECTED CLASSES

The Selected Classes (Standard, Jumpers with Weaves, PAD & Steeplechase) follow the Agility Trials Rules & Regulations. The courses will be the same as in the Regular Classes but will have adjusted height and course times. The dog must be entered only in Selected Classes or in Regular Classes and may not move back and forth between the Selected Classes and the Regular Classes. Once a dog is entered in the Selected Classes, the dog may not go back to compete in the Regular Classes.

VETERANS CLASS

At the option of the handler, a dog 7 years of age or older may be entered in the Veterans Class. Once a dog has been designated as a Veteran and entered in this class, the dog cannot revert/transfer back to the Regular or Selected Classes. The dog will retain titles and/or Qualifying scores towards titles accumulated. Any new titles earned will be designated with the letter 'V' for Veteran following the title (e.g. AGMXV).

Veteran dogs run the same course as Regular dogs but may jump 1 or 2 heights lower than Regular and will be allowed an additional 10% over Regular SCT.

Veterans Class is available in Standard, Jumpers with Weaves, PAD & Steeplechase.

Height Divisions - owners are responsible for entering the correct height divisions. The judge may require any dog to be measured.

REGULAR CLASSES: Standard, JWW & PAD

- 8 inches -----for dogs 10 inches and under at the withers
- 12 inches -----for dogs over 10 inches up to and including 14 inches at the withers
- 16 inches -----for dogs over 14 inches up to and including 18 inches at the withers
- 20 inches -----for dogs over 18 inches up to and including 22 inches at the withers
- 24 inches -----for dogs over 22 inches at the withers

Height Divisions (cont'd.)

SELECTED CLASSES: Standard, JWW & PAD

- 4 inches -----for dogs 10 inches and under at the withers
- 8 inches -----for dogs over 10 inches up to and including 14 inches at the withers
- 12 inches -----for dogs over 14 inches up to and including 18 inches at the withers
- 16 inches -----for dogs over 18 inches up to and including 22 inches at the withers
- 20 inches -----for dogs over 22 inches at the withers

VETERANS CLASSES: Standard, JWW & PAD

- 4 inches -----for dogs 10 inches and under at the withers
- 4 or 8 inches -----for dogs over 10 inches up to and including 14 inches at the withers
- 8 or 12 inches -----for dogs over 14 inches up to and including 18 inches at the withers
- 12 or 16 inches -----for dogs over 18 inches up to and including 22 inches at the withers
- 16 or 20 inches -----for dogs over 22 inches at the withers



ENTRY FEE INFORMATION (cont.)

Cheques dated after the close of entries will be considered Post-Closing entries. Post-Closing entry fees will apply.

NO entry will be accepted without payment in full. Tendering of a N.S.F. cheque in payment of entry fees is considered non-payment of entry fees and is an offence punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards.

All N.S.F. cheques and declined credit cards will be assessed a \$50.00 service charge. (Chapter 8.8, C.K.C. Dog Show Rules). There will not be any refunds on duplicate entries or overpayments.

The owner of a dog entered in this show is entirely responsible for any errors in the entering of the dog, regardless of how, or by whom the entry was made.

Greyhound Express entries must be prepaid for delivery and will not be picked up.

Do not send entries by Registered Mail. Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted.

Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor.

Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks.

LATE ENTRIES

Entries will be accepted after the closing date with the following conditions:

There will be no discount packages allowed.

Entry must be received by 5 pm on the afternoon before the start of the trial being entered.

SPECIAL AGILITY AWARD

The Alberta Kennel Club is pleased to offer: 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th place cash prizes in the amounts of \$150, \$125, \$75 and \$50 respectively to the agility competitors achieving the top 4 aggregate scores over the CKC Agility Trials being held on August 3 & 4, 2014.

The points will be awarded as follows for each Qualifying run earned over the two days:

Novice: 2 pts

Exhibitor Wrist Bands are required for entry. **Please bring receipt to AKC tent to get wrist bands**

Exhibitors Please Note: It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing.

1. Dog Show Rule books, Obedience Trial & Agility Trial regulations are available from the Canadian Kennel Club. Cost is \$6.00 (plus 5% GST) per copy.
2. The Show Superintendent will be in full charge of the show, which will be governed by CKC rules. All rules and regulations, as outlined in the Alberta Kennel Club premium list, will also apply to these trials.
3. Entries will be acknowledged after entry closing, with receipt, judging schedule. Should such acknowledgment not be received one week prior to the show, please contact the Show Secretary at: email k9centre@telusplanet.net 403-238-6715.
4. Bitches in Season are not permitted to compete. Entry fees will be refunded when a bitch comes into season after their entry has been submitted to the Trial Secretary, when a Veterinarian's certificate, certifying the bitch was in season within the 10 day period preceding the trial, reaches the Secretary on or before the start of the trial.
5. Only the dogs officially entered in these Agility Trials are permitted within the precincts of the trial.
6. Before each trial the judges will provide a course design which will be posted before judging begins. Courses will be different for all four trials

The show committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of any accident, or other misfortune, to either dogs, exhibitors, patrons or property.

Dogs not entered in the show will not be allowed on the show premises unless In-Transit. An In-Transit area will be provided.

Exhibitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of and will comply with the CKC Agility Rules and Regulations. At the option of the handler, a dog may wear either a well-fitting plain buckle collar, a quick-release collar, or no collar. Fancy collars, choke collars, pinch collars, or other training collars are prohibited. Collars which are too tight or so large that they hang down unreasonable in front of the dog are not permitted. There shall be nothing hanging from the collar (12.3.1) Food and toys are not permitted in the course area and handlers are not permitted to use whistles or other training devices in the ring or within 10 feet of the course (12.1.1)

Planning Your Stay at the Summer Classic

The Alberta Kennel Club is thrilled to be holding our show at Spruce Meadows once again! Holding our event there comes with some significant responsibilities for ALL OF US – volunteers and exhibitors alike. You will agree that this is not your normal facility and rules must be followed.

You must clean up after your dog. Please Keep Baggies With You At All Times. Discourage the boys from casually lifting their legs on fences, posts, trees or shrubs. Think of this as your home for the weekend – we are sure that you wouldn't allow it in your house so don't let it happen on the show grounds.

Failure to pick-up after your dogs will result in automatic expulsion from the show and the show grounds. This will be enforced. Our aim is to continue building a long relationship with Spruce Meadows and that will happen if we all work together.

Some Basic Requests:

1. Spruce Meadows does not allow overnight tenting (i.e. no tenting on their grounds).
2. Parking will be allowed only in areas designated by the Alberta Kennel Club. Handicapped Parking stalls are limited and any parking in areas which are designated as "No Parking" will not be permitted. There is handicapped parking and shuttle transportation from parking lot #7 during the hours of the Show.
All unauthorized parking in "No Parking" space will be subject to towing. NO EXCEPTIONS.
3. All RV's must have boards under all of their tires and generators – Sorry, No exceptions!
4. Please be prepared to bring leveling materials for your unit.
5. For all Motor homes, please ensure you have your exhaust pipe extension, this is a mandatory requirement.
6. There will be absolutely **NO dumping of grey water or sewage** on Spruce Meadows grounds permitted – Thank-you
7. Water & electrical hook-ups are not available for RV units.
8. Information about availability of water and sewer services for RV guests will be included with the judging schedule and at www.albertakennelclub.org as soon as available. These services are not offered through the AKC but will be available for direct purchase from the service provider(s).
9. Parking is a privilege extended by Spruce Meadows and the Alberta Kennel Club.
10. All parking is at your own risk.
11. Complimentary shuttle services to and from the RV areas and public parking lot throughout the entire day, pick-up and drop off locations will be made available to you upon arrival in your welcome package.
12. We offer Complimentary Showers for our exhibitors – ***The Alberta Kennel Club greatly appreciates any donations towards offsetting the cost of the showers.***
13. Generators - Please ensure they are off please between the hours of 11 PM and 6:00 AM – this is the designated "quiet time" for our friends and neighbors.



Please note: An exhibitor has the right to withdraw an entry up to the closing date and time as published in the premium list. This may be done by telephone but written or electronic notification must be received by the Show Secretary no later than the official closing date and time. If written notification is not received by that time, the dog will remain entered in the show.

CKC Non-Member Participation Fee (24-12-3)

a) An annual non-member participation fee for awards and titles will be charged to a Canadian non-member of CKC. The fee will match the ERN fee.

b) In order to protect the awards/titles earned, the non-member will have a choice either to become a CKC member or to pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will cause all awards and titles to be cancelled.

c) **"these fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by Canadian resident non-CKC members and are not applicable to CKC members"**

*Please note that the CKC Membership Application and the Non-Member Participation Fee forms are available on the website, <http://www.ckc.ca> under CKC Services and then Forms On-line. If submitting a Membership Application, please ensure that you also complete the Non-Member Participation Fee form so that we are aware of the dogs involved.

Information for US Exhibitors on entering Canada

- To enter Canada from the States, US Citizens must show proof of identity; however as of June 1, 2009, to enter back into the United States, all US Citizens age 16 or older must have a valid Passport or Approved Secure Travel Document.
- Please be aware that all dogs must have a valid rabies certificate to cross the border. A valid rabies vaccination that has been given at least 30 days prior to entry into Canada is required to bring a dog into this country. Government regulations require a rabies vaccination certificate be provided for each dog. NOTE: Dogs less than three months of age do not require rabies vaccination.

EVENT REGISTRATION NUMBERS: All dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events do not require a CKC registration number but will require an Event Registration Number (ERN). To obtain an ERN, simply mail or fax a copy of the dog's registration certificate with a cheque, money order payable to the Canadian Kennel Club or VISA/MasterCard number including expiry date, cardholder's name and signature. **Cost is \$58.50 + 5% GST.** This Event Registration Number MUST be applied for with 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC Event. NEW! CKC Canine Companion Program For Mixed And Unrecognized Breeds

Effective: July 1, 2014

VI. SHOWS & TRIALS

X Canine Companion Number (CCN)

1. Definitions

- a) Mixed Breed dog: is a dog of unknown ancestry that belongs to no recognized breed and is not the result of selective breeding.
- b) Unrecognized breed: is a dog of known ancestry not on the CKC list of recognized or miscellaneous breeds and that is registered with a Registry recognized by the CKC.
- c) Recognized breed is a breed that CKC is authorized to register in accordance with the Animal Pedigree Act (APA) or a dog of a breed included in the CKC Miscellaneous Breed list

2. Purpose

- a) A Canine Companion Number (CCN) allows mixed and unrecognized breed dogs to participate in the CKC Performance Events of Agility, Obedience and Rally Obedience Trials.

3. Eligibility

- a) In order for a dog to receive a Canine Companion Number (CCN) the following criteria must be met:
 - 1) The dog must be either a mixed breed or unrecognized breed as defined herein.
 - 2) Mixed breed dogs must be spayed or neutered. Unrecognized breeds are not required to be spayed or neutered.
 - 3) The dog must be identified with a Canadian Kennel Club approved microchip.

4. Applying for a Canine Companion Number (CCN)

- a) Complete the Canadian Kennel Club Canine Companion Number application form.
- b) With the completed form, accompanying documentation must be included as follows
 - 1) Mixed breed dogs - proof of spay or neuter.
 - 2) Unrecognized dogs not eligible for registration by CKC and not on the Miscellaneous List – a copy of a registration certificate from a CKC recognized Registry.
- c) The appropriate fee as noted in the CKC fee schedule.

5. Upon receipt of a Canine Companion Number (CCN), the dog may be entered in any of the events noted in 2 a.

6. A dog that is eligible for a CCN may not be entered as a listed dog.

7. The Canadian Kennel Club may cancel for cause, any Canine Companion Number.

The CCN application form is available on the CKC web site under CKC Services/CKC Forms On-line/Registration.
