CLUB HISTORY

In 1969, seven people sat together and formed the Dandie Dinmont Terrier Club of Canada, a club dedicated to preserving and protecting this rare, unique and endearing breed.

It took several years before the fledgling DDTCC hosted its first booster show, which drew an entry of 16 dogs. By 1974 the club had the confidence and the funds, to hold its first Specialty Show, which attracted dogs from all across Canada and the United States to compete under British judge Audrey Hall-Parlby, (the daughter of the immortal Phyllis Salisbury of Salismore fame, and a Dandie breeder in her own right.) Since that time, the DDTCC has held its Specialty show ever other year, with the entries showing an increase with each decade. The most recent specialty was the 20th anniversary held in August 2012 with a total of 63 dogs entered. With rarely more than two dozen Dandies registered in Canada each year, the enthusiasm and support for our Specialty shows is remarkable!

For the past three decades, usually in conjunction with the Annual General Meetings, the club holds its annual "Fun Day" - which is not only our club picnic, and games day but an open house - an opportunity for people to see 30 or more Dandies in one location. We laughingly call it the "Olympics of Dandies", but in essence it is a series of "see if your dog will humiliate you" competitions. The events include running races, high jumps, a "gourmet" competition consisting of strange foodstuffs, and a masquerade competition which inspires people to dress their dogs from everything from "Yankee Doodle Dandies" to "Crocodile Dandee". One enterprising couple slithered their dog into a pair of pantyhose, put a mustache on his nose and instantly transformed him into a sea lion.

As Fun Day is our annual fund-raiser, we charge nominal amounts to enter each event, and each participant must bring a wrapped gift as their entry fee, which are then used as prizes for each competition. A fee for the lunch between the AGM and the Fun Day events, and a silent auction further adds to the club coffers.

This demonstrates our congenial and light side. But the DDTCC is also serious and concerned about the present state of the breed. Already one of the rarest breeds in North America, fewer puppies are being born each year. At the current rate of attrition, it is possible the breed will not survive successfully over the next few decades. Consequently, the Dandie Dinmont Terrier Club of Canada has several initiatives, designed to promote, protect and preserve our beloved breed.

Our well known "cuddling parlours", which are now duplicated world wide, are held at several public events annually - such as the Highlands of Durham Games each July in Uxbridge - which allows the public to hold, cuddle and fall in love with our breed. However, we do not seek to make the breed "popular", as this would be as disastrous for Dandies as it has been for other breeds.

The club holds regular grooming clinics, to teach our owners how to care for their dogs' coats themselves. Our members will go to any length to help the club, to help preserve the Dandie Dinmont, and, in addition, to preserve the original standard.

This is an important point. Perhaps a brief history of the standard would clarify our raison d'être. In 1876, Dandie experts from both sides of the border met in Melrose, Scotland to forge the original written Standard of Perfection for the Dandie Dinmont. The British standard remained as written, (with a small amendment regarding the desired weight range), for about a century, until the Kennel Club (England) required that all canine breed standards conform to the same format. Thus the original (1876) standard was changed.

As Britain is the "country of origin" for the Dandie, the FCI, (the ruling body for approximately 85 countries) accepted the new British standard. Only Britain, the USA and Canada are not members of the FCI. The American Kennel Club has its own written standard, which is approved only in the United States.

Thus, Canada is unique, as it is the only country in the world that accepts the original standard, one of the finest written and most descriptive and instructive of any breed standard. The Dandie Dinmont Terrier Club of Canada is dedicated to ensuring that this precious, original Dandie standard is preserved.

ENTRY INFORMATION

1. No entry will be accepted unless all particulars called for on the entry form are completed in full. Handlers or agents please note the full name and address of all owners **must be filled in**.
2. **Incomplete entries will be returned.** No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by entry fees. Telephone and telegraph entries cannot be accepted. Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom the entries were made. Every effort will be made to find duplicate entries, but if entry has been processed and appears in the official catalogue, **no refund** will be made.
3. Substitutions or cancellations of any entry after the closing date is prohibited. Moving Class Dogs to Specials is permitted. An error in the class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show. Only dogs which are already registered in the Canadian Kennel Club Stud Book, or are eligible for such registration can be entered. The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry subject to CKC Rules.
4. **ENTRIES POSITIVELY CLOSE 8:00 P.M. E.S.T. MONDAY, AUGUST 18, 2014** and must be in the hands of the Show Secretary by that date.
5. Identification cards and judging schedules will be mailed as soon as possible after the entries close. Identification cards must be presented upon arrival at the show. A judging schedule will be posted on www.dandiedinmont.org.
6. Tendering of NSF cheques in payment of fees shall be considered non-payment of fees and is punishable by disciplinary action. **Any N.S.F. cheques will be subject to a \$35.00 service charge.**

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Exhibitors will be allowed to set up after 10 a.m. Saturday September 6th. Please use Robertson Crescent, the road to the west of the building to unload. Parking is available opposite the Pawsway Centre at the Radisson Hotel; outside, one block further west on Queens Quay; or underground east of Harbourfront Centre.
2. **ENTRIES POSITIVELY CLOSE 8:00 P.M. MONDAY, AUGUST 18TH.** To comply with instructions issued by the Canadian Kennel Club we will be unable to accept, cancel, or substitute an entry reaching our Show Secretary after the closing date.
3. All entry confirmations and Judging Schedules will be mailed as soon after entries close as possible. A Judging Schedule will be posted on the MJN website: mjnshowservices.com It is YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO VERIFY the receipt of any electronic entries prior to the advertised closing date. A valid means of payment must accompany all entries.
4. Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom the entry was made. Every effort will be made to find duplicate entries, but if entry has been processed and appears in the official catalogue, **NO REFUND** will be made.
5. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have the dog in the ring when the dog's class is called to be judged.
6. The DDTCC, its officers & associates and the Pawsway event centre will use due care & diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of an accident, or misfortune, to either dogs, exhibitors, or patrons.
7. If because of riots, civil disturbances, or other acts beyond the control of the management, it is impossible to open or complete the show, no refund of entry fees will be made.
8. The Show Superintendent will be in complete charge of the show, which will be governed by the rules of the Canadian Kennel Club (CKC).
9. **SHOW PRECINCTS:** The show precincts shall consist of the area set out for the ring and the facilities set aside for show officials, judges, exhibitors and handlers.
10. Judging will commence at 1:00 pm unless otherwise posted.

NOTE: Due to space limitations the Show Superintendent may restrict the placing of chairs, tables and crates and may limit the use of private exercise pens. Exhibitors are asked to immediately clean up or arrange for clean up after their dogs at the show buildings and grounds, parking areas and motels.

MR GEOFF CORISH
GILL LANE, LONGTON, PRESTON, LANCASHIRE, PR4 4SS ENGLAND

Geoff Corish began with West Highland White Terriers as a teenager and bred a Champion in his very first litter. He then began handling professionally and handled a record number of Westies to their English championship. Branching into other breeds, he has made champions in hundreds of breeds including Dandie Dinmonts. Geoff began breeding Lhasa Apsos under his SEALAW affix and owned the legendary Ch Saxonsprings Fresno, Britain's Dog of the Year, acknowledged as the greatest of her breed.



In 2013 Mr. Corish judged Best in Show at Crufts, the world's largest dog show. He was the Terrier group judge at Crufts 2000 and the Non Sporting group judge in 2012. Renowned internationally, he has officiated in Austria, Holland, Belgium, Luxembourg, Norway, Sweden, Finland, Denmark, Spain, USA, Australia, New Zealand, Japan, South Africa, and Thailand. Assignments in India and China will be in late 2014.

Mr. Corish and his partner Michael Coad of Pamplona Bichon Frise and Standard Poodle fame, have been the UK's top kennel for 13 consecutive years. They are owned by a Dandie Dinmont named Minnie.

This is Geoff Corish's first judging assignment in Canada.

**NON-MEMBER
PARTICIPATION
FEE**

Effective January 1, 2011:

- A non-member participation fee will be charged to a resident of Canada who is a non-member of the CKC. The fee will be \$58.50 plus applicable taxes.
- The non-member participation fee is paid in any year a title is earned and covers all titles and dogs owned by that individual.
- In order for the title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in the title being withheld and the dog cannot be moved up to the next level.
- The fee applies only to dogs wholly owned by non-member residents of Canada and is not applicable to CKC members.

CHAMPIONS AND CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

Chapter 15, Section 15.1.1 A dog awarded Winners at a conformation show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the number of championship points credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be as provided hereunder.

Section 15.1.2 The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows:

Dogs competing*	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 or more
Points allocated	0	1	2	3	4	5

*includes the dog awarded Winners.

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge SHALL be included in the calculation for championship points.

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed, or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above.

Section 15.1.12. In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion and its owner provided with a Championship Certificate, the dog must have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed or group level.

MOVING CLASS DOGS TO SPECIALS

Chapter 8, Section 8.9 of the Conformation Show Rules and Regulations has been amended to allow a dog which is individually registered in the records of the Canadian Kennel Club, and has completed the requirements for a Championship, after the Closing Date for entries for a show, may be transferred from one of the Regular Classes to "Specials Only", providing the request for a transfer is submitted to the Show Secretary in WRITING at least one hour prior to the opening of the show, by the owner or handler. Every day of a 2 or 3 day show is a separate show. Please note that this rule is effective up to one hour prior to the opening of the show, NOT one hour prior to the judging of the breed.

The Exhibitor is responsible for knowing and complying with the Conformation Show Rules and Regulations of the Canadian Kennel Club.

Chapter 4 - Section 4.1.3 of the Conformation Show Rules and Regulations states: A judge officiating at a show held under these rules shall not be subjected to indignities of any kind during the progress of the show. It shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out.

Effective Jan. 1/92, all dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will no longer require a CKC registration number but will require an Event Registration Number (ERN). The ERN number *must* be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event. **Fee is \$59.50 per dog.** For further information contact: The Canadian Kennel Club. SPECIALTY CONFORMATION CLASSES - BOTH SEXES

OFFICIAL CLASSES

Baby Puppy*: A dog between 3 and 6 months of age
Junior Puppy - a dog between 6 months and under 9 months on day of show.
Senior Puppy - a dog between 9 months and under 12 months on day of show.
12 - 18 Months - a dog between 12 months and under 18 months on day of show.

Canadian Bred - a dog which is born in Canada. Champions of any country are excluded.

Bred By Exhibitor - dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder. The handler must be the owner/co-owner and breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The breeder/owner must handle the dog in this class, but need not handle the dog for further awards.

Open Class - for all dogs.

Veterans - for all dogs over seven years of age as of the date of the show. These dogs to compete for the regular placements and the 1st place Dog and Bitch will go on to compete for Best of Breed. The winner of the Veterans Class will not compete for points but go directly into the Best of Breed competition. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered.

Specials Only - dogs who are Canadian Champions only.

Exhibition Only - all dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competition. Dogs entered in this class may not compete in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes and/or Parades.

Award of Merit - At the judge's discretion, Awards of Merit may be awarded up to one Award for every ten dogs competing for Best of Breed. Rosettes will be given for the Awards of Merit which will be presented following Best of Breed.

Best Canadian Bred in Specialty - will be awarded at this show.

SEXUALLY ALTERED CLASSES

Limited to dogs and bitches over 6 months of age which have been sexually altered by veterinarian procedure.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES

Brace: Two dogs of same breed (not necessarily of the same sex) and must be handled by one person on one lead. Dogs may be spayed or neutered.

Stud Dog & Get: Entry comprises the Stud Dog and two or more of his Get, ownership in this class need not be identical. Stud Dog may be neutered.

Brood Bitch & Progeny: Entry comprises the Brood Bitch and two or more of her Progeny, ownership in this class need not be identical. Brood Bitch may be spayed.

Each entrant for Brace, Stud Dog, or Brood Bitch must be entered in one of the Official Classes in the Specialty or Exhibition Only. All Get and Progeny must be entered in an Official Class.

UNOFFICIAL CLASS

Parade of Champions: This is a non-competitive class, open to all Champion Dandie Dinmont Terriers. Owners are encouraged to include a brief, typed resume of their dog's achievements.
