ATTENTION FOREIGN EXHIBITORS

Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in U.S. funds it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par" as they will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds. Your understanding and co-operation is appreciated. Thank you.

Tendering of an NSF cheque in payment of entry fees will be considered non-payment of entry fees and is an offence punishable by CKC disciplinary actions and cancellation of awards.

The owner of a dog entered in this show is entirely responsible for any error in the entering of the dog regardless of how, or by whom the entry was made.

There will be no refunds on overpayments or duplicate entries.

CLASSIFICATIONS

The following CKC classes (divided by sex) will be provided:

Junior Puppy	for dogs 6 months of age but under 9 months of age
Senior Puppy	for dogs 9 months of age but under 12 months of age
12-15 Months	for dogs 12 months of age but under 15 months of age
15-18 Months	for dogs 15 months of age but under 18 months of age
Canadian Bred	for dogs born in Canada; champions in any country excluded
Bred by Exhibitor	for dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder
Open	for all dogs. This class will be divided by colour – Black & Landseer
+7-9 Years Veteran	for any dogs 7 years of age but under 9 years of age
+9 Years & older Veteran	for any dog 9 years of age and older
	Veterans dogs do not compete for Winners, but the winners of these classes shall go on to compete for Best of Breed. DOGS COMPETING IN THIS CLASS MAY BE SPAYED OR NEUTERED.
Specials Only	dogs which are <u>Registered Individually</u> in the records of the Canadian Kennel Club or have a CKC ERN and have attained championship status may be entered in the “Specials Only” class. Entry of a dog in “Specials Only” is not prohibited on the grounds that the title of champion has not been confirmed by the CKC, but if it is found later that the dog had not attained championship status before the entry had been made, then all awards attained at the show will be cancelled. The entry of a “listed” dog in Specials Only is not allowed.
Exhibition Only	for all dogs over 3 months of age and eligible for registration with the Canadian Kennel Club

NON-REGULAR, UNOFFICIAL & SWEEPSTAKES CONFORMATION CLASSES & PARADES

TO COMPETE IN THE JUVENILE SWEEPSTAKES CLASS, DOGS MUST BE ENTERED IN REGULAR CLASS, OR FOR SPECIALS ONLY. ENTRY IN THE JUVENILE SWEEPSTAKES FROM THE EXHIBITION ONLY CLASS IS NOT ALLOWED. DOGS ENTERED IN THE VETERAN SWEEPSTAKES MAY BE ENTERED IN EXHIBITION ONLY. SWEEPSTAKES WILL FOLLOW THE RALLY & OBEDIENCE TRIALS ON SATURDAY EVENING.

SWEEPSTAKES

Classes will be divided by sex as below:

<u>Juvenile Sweepstakes</u>	<u>Veteran Sweepstakes</u>
6-9 months	7 – 9 years
9-12 months	9 years and older
12-15 months	
15-18 months	

All dogs must be entered in the regular classes: Veterans, Specials Only, or for Exhibition Only to compete in the following non-regular classes. Dogs competing in these classes may be spayed or neutered.

Working	Divided by sex. For any dog that holds a Draft or Water Rescue Title from either the CKC (DD, DDX, BDD, BDDX, WRD, WRDX) or the NCA (DD, TDD, WD, WRD.).
Stud Dog	Stud dog and TWO or more of his Get, not necessarily owned by the same owner.
Brood Bitch	Brood bitch and TWO or more of her Progeny, not necessarily owned by the same owner.
Brace	Two dogs (either sex or mixed) shown on one lead, not necessarily owned by the same owner.

PARADES

Include a short written article along with your entry

May be altered and shown in unorthodox trim

Must be entered in an Official event or Exhibition Only

Parade of Titlists – For any Newfoundland holding a title. ie, working, obedience, championship, CGN.

Parade of Veterans – For any Newfoundland seven years of age or older on the day of the Specialty

OBEDIENCE TRIAL – SATURDAY MORNING, SEPTEMBER 1, 2012

The following obedience classes will be offered:

Novice A, Novice B, Open A, Open B, Utility A, Utility B, Pre-Novice, Novice C, Novice Intermediate, Brace & Veterans

Please ensure jump height is indicated on entry form for the Open & Utility classes.

Regular Obedience Classes:

Transition Classes: *Scores earned by dogs entered in Transition Classes are not eligible for High in Trial.*

Pre-Novice: is an elective class and earning the title is not a requirement to enter Novice Classes. The Pre-Novice Class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed which has not earned the title of PCD. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 5 exercises

unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in Group Exercises. Only dogs that have not earned the title of CD may enter the Pre-Novice class.

Novice A: for any dog of any recognized or listed breed which has not earned the title of CD. Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families and must be eligible to handle under section 10.1.4 (as follows). No person who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a CDX title shall be allowed to handle a dog in this class. When a dog is wrongfully entered in this class, any score awarded will be cancelled.

Novice B: for any dog of any recognized breed which has not earned the title of CD. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all six exercises unless he has two or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the Group Exercises. No dog may be entered in both Novice A and Novice B Class at any one trial.

Novice C: for any dog recognized or listed breed that has earned the title CD, CDX, or UD or any Obedience Trial Championship title prior to the closing date of the trial in which it is to be entered. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the Group Exercises. Dogs may compete in the Novice C class indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs entered in this Class **are not eligible for High In Trial** and do not qualify a dog for any title. Dogs may be entered in the Novice C Class in addition to any other Official or Unofficial classes for which they are eligible.

Novice Intermediate: is an elective class and earning the title is not a requirement to enter the Open Classes. Novice Intermediate shall be for any dogs of any recognized or listed breed which has earned the title of Companion Dog, Companion Dog Excellent, Utility Dog or any Obedience Trial Championship. Score earned by dogs competing in this class are **not eligible for High In Trial**. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 6 exercises.

Open A: for any dog of any recognized or listed breed which has earned the title of CD but has not earned the title CDX. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner or a member of the immediate families. Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. Any person who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a UD title may not handle a dog in this class. A dog which has earned its CDX title is not eligible for entry in this class but may be entered in the Open B Class. When a dog is wrongfully entered in this class, any score awarded will be cancelled.

Open B: for any dog of any recognized or listed breed which has earned the title of CD. Dogs which have earned the title of CDX or UD must enter the Open B Class. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter or handle more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all 7 exercises unless he has 2 or more dogs entered. In such case, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the Group Exercises. No dog may be entered in both the Open A and Open B classes at any one trial. A dog eligible for entry in the Utility Class at any obedience trial held under these rules is also eligible for entry in the Open Class B at the same trial. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will decide the order of exercises to be performed. This order will not be disclosed to exhibitors until it is posted at ring side, approximately 30 minutes before the start of the class. In future assignments, judges are required to alternate the six orders of exercises so that each set will be used approximately the same number of times.

Utility A: for any dog of any recognized breed or listed breed which has earned the title of CDX but has not earned the title of UD. Any person who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a MOTCH title may not handle a dog in this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner or a member of the immediate families. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises. When a dog is wrongfully entered in this class, any score awarded will be cancelled.

Utility B: for any dog of any recognized breed or listed breed which has earned the title of CDX or UD. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises. No dog may be entered in both the Utility A and Utility B classes at any one trial. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will decide the order of exercises to be performed. This order will not be disclosed to exhibitors until it is posted at the ring side, approximately 30 minutes before the start of the class. In future assignments, judges are required to alternate the six orders of exercises so that each will be used approximately the same number of times.

Unofficial Obedience Classes: PLEASE NOTE: Dogs entered in non-regular or unofficial classes must be entered in a regular class in the trial or for Exhibition Only.

Brace: for dogs of either sex that have attained at least a Canadian CD title, not necessarily with the same ownership.

Veteran: for dogs which have attained at least a Canadian CD title and are age seven years or older.

RALLY OBEDIENCE TRIAL – Saturday Morning, Sept 1, 2012

The following classes will be offered: Novice A, Novice B, Advanced A, Advanced B, Excellent A, Excellent B

Please ensure jump height is indicated on entry form for Advance and Excellent Classes

Regular Rally Obedience Classes:

Novice A: Dogs competing in this class may not have won a CKC Rally Novice (RN) title or any CKC Novice Obedience title. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC CDX (Companion Dog Excellent) title or instructed dog training classes shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class. However, a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has won the title. No dog may be entered in both Rally Novice A and Rally Novice B at any one trial.

Novice B: Any dog may compete in this class until a qualifying score in the Rally Advanced Class is earned. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

Advanced A: This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Novice (R. N.) title but have not won the Rally Advanced (R. A.) title or any CKC Novice Obedience title. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC CDX (Companion Dog Excellent) title or instructed dog training classes shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class. However, a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has won the title. No dog may be entered in both Rally Advanced A and Rally Advanced B at any one trial.

Advanced B: This class will be for dogs that have won the Rally Novice (R.N.) title. A dog completing the Rally Advanced (R.A.) title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

Excellent A. This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced (R. A.) title, but have not won the Rally Excellent (R. E.) title or any CKC Novice Obedience title. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC CDX (Companion Dog Excellent) title or instructed dog training classes shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class. However, a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has won the title. No dog may be entered in both Rally Excellent A and Rally Excellent B at any one trial.

Excellent B: This class will be for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced (R.A.) title. A dog completing the Rally Excellent (R.E.) title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

Exhibition Only Obedience/Rally O: For all dogs of age and eligible for registration with the Canadian Kennel Club

Entry fees will be refunded when a bitch entered in Obedience comes into season after the close of entries if a Veterinarian's Certificate (certifying that the bitch was in season within the 10 day period preceding the trial) is delivered to the Trial Secretary prior to the start of the Trial. The Newfoundland Dog Fanciers of Alberta will refund entry, recording & listing fees if the above conditions are met.

To obtain an ERN, simply ...

- Send a photocopy of the dog's Registration Certificate reflecting current ownership with a written request for an ERN number.
- Please indicate coat type and size, if applicable.
- Fee for an Event Registration Number with the CKC is \$57.60 + GST. Include your payment in the full amount in Canadian funds.
- Payment may be made with Visa or Master Card, personal or business cheque or money order. For Non-Members, please note that if paying by cheque, the cheque must be certified. Non-residents of Canada, please note that discounted cheques or money orders will not be accepted due to fluctuating currency rates.
- Provide us with your full return address.
- Faxed requests will be accepted. Please ensure that your Visa or Master Card number is legible and you have included your expiry date and signature.

An ERN must be obtained within thirty (30) days of obtaining points, awards or scores to avoid cancellation. If factors beyond your control prohibit this or present a problem, please send a written request for a thirty (30) day extension. *****NEW TRACKING FEE FOR NON-MEMBERS*****

Effective January 1, 2011, the CKC will be instituting a tracking fee for all Canadian residents who participate in a CKC event, but are not CKC members. In order to cover the clerical costs of recording and tracking points and awards earned at a CKC event, a participating non-member can choose to purchase a CKC membership or pay a dog-specific tracking fee (\$55.00). This only applies to dogs wholly owned by non-members and is not applicable to CKC members or dogs co-owned with a CKC member. In order for the CKC to efficiently manage recording and tracking points, it's important that non-members select one of the two options within 30 days of notification or, unfortunately, we will be forced to cancel any awards and titles.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. The Show Superintendent will be in full charge of the show which will be governed by CKC rules. All rules and regulations, as outlined in the Saskatoon Kennel & Obedience Club's premium list will also apply to this specialty.
2. Entries will not be acknowledged after entry closing, with receipt and judging schedules. If such acknowledgement is not received one week before the show date, please contact the Show Secretary, Pat Button, 306-374-6611, p.button@sasktel.net

Please note: An exhibitor has the right to withdraw an entry up to the closing date and time as published in the premium list. If written notification is not received by that time, the dog will remain entered in the show and no refund will be made.

CHAMPIONS AND CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

A dog awarded WINNERS at a Championship show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the number of championship points credited to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as provided hereunder. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points awarded WINNERS shall be as follows:

Competing*	1	2	3-5	6-9	10-12	13 or more
Points	0	1	2	3	4	5

*Includes the dog awarded Winners

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall **NOT** be included in the calculation for points. If a dog awarded WINNERS is also awarded BEST OF BREED at the show, then all dogs competing in the breed, including Specials Only, shall be included in the total. If a dog awarded WINNERS is also awarded BEST OF OPPOSITE SEX to Best of Breed, then all dogs of the same sex including those competing for Specials Only shall be included in the total. If a dog is awarded WINNERS is also awarded BEST OF WINNERS, then all dogs defeated directly or indirectly in the breed shall be included in the total. If a dog is awarded WINNERS only, then all the dogs of the same sex in the class competition shall be included the total. The number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be determined by the highest award earned and calculated as per this Section.

CLARIFICATION: Example of directly or indirectly defeating: If the Winners Bitch is awarded Best of Opposite Sex but not Best of Winners, the Best of Winners Male shall be deemed to have indirectly defeated the Specials Bitches, and is thus entitled to add them to the number of dogs and bitches defeated.

In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion and its owner provided with a Championship Certificate, the dog must:

- a) earn at least 10 championship points under at least 3 different judges and
- b) be registered in the records of the CKC, have an Event Registration Number (ERN).
- c) have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed or group level.

The board interprets the words "earn at least 10 championship points under 3 different judges" to mean:

- a) 3 or more Winners awards at not less than 3 different shows, under 3 different judges at the breed level.
- b) each of the 3 Winners awards must have earned one or more championship points, not necessarily at the breed level.

c) all the points required for championship status may be earned at the breed or group level or a combination of both breed and group level.

An error in the class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour BEFORE the start of the show.
