TCN fee: A **\$10.50** (inc. GST) TCN must accompany the entry of a dog not registered with the CKC.

All owners of unregistered, CKC-recognized breeds entering events are required to obtain a *Temporary Competition Number* (TCN). A TCN allows a dog of a recognized breed that is eligible for CKC registration to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN). Dogs that require a Miscellaneous Certification Number, Performance Event Number, or Canine Companion Number, are not eligible for a TCN.

A TCN must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event. The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered or has an ERN. Registration or ERN must be applied for within 30 days of the trial or all awards will be cancelled.

TCNs can be obtained:

- Online through CKC's Portal (Note: Individuals who have not yet used the online Portal will be required to create a Portal account before they can submit a TCN application online);
- By submitting a completed <u>paper application</u> by mail to CKC; or
- By contacting the Shows and Trials Division Toll Free at 1-855-364-7252.

Please note the CKC ruling: Canadian Resident non-CKC members running a wholly owned dog cannot win a placement unless they pay a non-member participation fee or a membership fee to the CKC. These fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by non-CKC members and are not applicable to CKC members.

Payment: <u>Preferred entry and payment is through DogShow.ca</u>.





A service charge of 5% will be assessed. This includes entries sent online, by fax or post using a credit card or interac for payment.

ATTENTION

- 1. Official Catalogues will be emailed to the handlers the one day before the test. It will list the running order, with handler and dog call name. Please print this if you wish for your own use.
- 2. Each Marshall and Head Quarters will have a catalogue to view.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Paper entries must be typewritten or clearly printed, completely filled out and signed.
- Owners are responsible for errors on entry forms or where hand-writing is not clearly legible. No phone, faxed
 or late entries will be accepted.
- A separate entry form for EACH dog in EACH test is required.
- Bitches in season are not eligible for entry and are not allowed on or near the test grounds.
- Bitches may be subject to vetting.
- ♦ Entry and TCN fees paid for any dog withdrawn because of estrus, illness or death shall be refunded in full. An appropriate veterinary certificate must be given to the Test Secretary before the start of the test to qualify for a refund. All refunds must be requested in writing via email to FVRTC.hunt.sec@gmail.com and once the catalogue has been printed, will be less CKC event fees and TCN fees if applicable. Other refunds (less a scratch fee of \$10.00 per dog) may be given in extraordinary circumstances at the discretion of the Test Committee and must be requested in writing and received by the Test Secretary within 7 days of the last day of the test.
- Males and females will run in the order of the draw or at the discretion of the Marshall.
- Ducks or Pheasants, will be used on land and ducks will be used for all water tests.
- All participants and spectators shall wear hunting attire, dark or camouflage clothing.
- ♦ There is no concession on the test grounds,
- Official CKC Rosettes and duck bands will be awarded to all qualifying dogs at the end of the test.
- ♦ Section 2.5.1 There shall be no training of dogs on the grounds of a hunt test, except for single training bumpers which are thrown by hand by the handler, either within 24 hours of the commencement of the event, or at any time during the event. The Hunt Test Committee is responsible for enforcement of this provision.
- Section 2.5.2 Electronic collars (either dummy or live) as well as prong or pinch type collars shall not be worn by a dog on the grounds of a Hunt Test at any time during the event with the exception of those collars designed to curb barking which may be worn by a dog while kenneled.
- ♦ Section 3.8.1 A judge officiating at a hunt test held under these rules shall not be subjected to any indignities of any kind during the progress of the hunt test. It shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the hunt test to see that this rule is effectively carried out.
- Section 20.7 It shall be the duty and obligation of the event giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at a hunt test held under these regulations, is not subject to any indignities. The Hunt Test Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. A copy of this regulation shall be prominently placed in every premium list and catalogue.

- ♦ The FVRTC is a member in good standing with the Canadian National Master Retriever Club. As of July 1, 2010 only passes at Hunt Tests hosted by clubs in good standing of the Canadian National Master Retriever Club are considered in determining eligibility to enter the National Master Hunt Test Stake.
- PLEASE NOTE the Non-Member Participation Fee was effective January 1, 2011. An Annual Non-Member Participation Fee for awards and titles will be charged to a CANADIAN NON-MEMBER OF THE CKC. The fee will match the ERN fee. In order to protect the awards/titles earned, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or to pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will cause all awards and titles to be cancelled. These fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by non-CKC members and are not applicable to CKC members.

Please respect the landowners that have so graciously allowed us on their land by obeying all signage, removing all garbage and debris. Close all gates and park ONLY where advised.

Release and Indemnification:

By participating in these tests (as handler, spectator or in any other role) each participant agrees to assume all risk and hazards incidental to these tests and agrees to release and to save harmless and indemnify the Fraser Valley Retriever Training Club Society and its members, any volunteer and the owners of the property upon which the tests are held together with their officers, agents, employees and representatives from all claims, actions, cost expenses and demands in respect to death, injury, loss or damage to the person or property of the participant howsoever caused, arising out of or in connection with the participants use or entry upon the property. It is understood that this agreement is binding upon the participants, his or her heirs, executors and assigns.

COVID -19 GUIDELINES: PLEASE READ PRIOR TO ARRIVAL

- If you are experiencing any COVID-19 symptoms, stay home. Refer to symptoms list below.
- The Province of BC recommends all people 12 and over be fully vaccinated and receive a booster dose
- Keep in mind you are at greater risk if you are over the age of 60 or with underlying medical conditions. Be informed of your risk, think through your risk tolerance and take extra precautions.
- Bring your own duck call and whistle as these items won't be supplied.
- We recommend you keep a bottle of hand sanitizer in your pocket at all times.
- Avoid common use pens/pencils bring your own. Please use your own personal chair, cooler, umbrella, etc.
- If you must use or handle club equipment, or equipment or materials that other people will be handling, we recommend you sanitize your hands before and after handling.
- Bring your own mask and gloves (if you choose to wear them).
- Parking Park with sufficient distance between vehicles
- Treat everyone with respect, some people wear masks out of courtesy.
- Social distancing is recommended (at least 2 metres between others). Be mindful when speaking with others. Consider wearing masks when in close proximity to others.
- Remove all your garbage from the grounds as there won't be garbage bins available.
- Follow Marshall's instructions regarding running order and entering the holding blinds.
- · Consider wearing gloves when handling birds.
- You may be asked to place the bird in the bucket and/or on the drying rack and/or on the ground. Judges will not be required to take the bird from the handler. It will be left to the judge's discretion as to how this is handled at each stake.
- COVID-19 rules may be subject to change.

DIRECTIONS TO HUNT TEST SITE

16250 48th Avenue, Surrey BC

From Highway #1: Take exit #53 for BC-15 S toward USA Border. Continue straight onto Pacific Hwy/BC-15 S (176th Street) for 8.4 km. Turn right onto 56 Ave/BC-10 W and continue for 1.3km. Turn Left onto 168th Street and continue for 1.5km. Turn right onto 48th Avenue. Continue on 48th for 1.1km. Destination will be on the left – Watch for signs and please drive slowly on grounds as there are horses, dogs and other people present.

From the USA: Pacific Hwy Border Crossing. From the US/Canadian border, continue north on Highway 15 (176th Street) for 4.9 miles. Turn left (west) onto 40th Avenue and continue for 1 mile. Turn right (north) onto 168th Street and continue for 1.1 miles. Turn left (west) onto 48th Avenue and continue for 0.7 miles. Destination will be on the left – watch for signs and please drive slowly on grounds as there are horses, dogs and other people present.

Jackman Wetlands 26895 - 8th Ave, Aldergrove, BC

From Highway #1: Take exit #73 to 264th Street and head south to 8th Avenue. Turn left (east). You will see a sign for OTS Training school on your left – Watch for signs and please drive slowly on grounds.

From the USA: Aldergrove Border Crossing opens at 8:00am. Head north on Highway 13 (264th Street) to 8th Avenue and turn right (east) - you will see OTS training school on your left – watch for signs and please drive slowly on the grounds.
