Your dog will not be eligible for awards such as High in Trial, High in Class or class placements but if a qualifying run occurs, the leg can go toward the title sought.*

**IMPORTANT AHBA RULE CHANGE - EFFECTIVE JUNE 1, 2010**

Effective June 1, 2010, all dogs participating in AHBA events must have full information including a registration number, provided for entry on recording forms. **The registration number to be used should be the dog's regular registration number. In the case of dogs which have more than one registration number, the owner must choose one and use it consistently for AHBA purposes. Owners of unregistered dogs may apply to the AHBA for a tracking number to be used in place of a registration number. The tracking number is only for dogs which are not otherwise registered.** The Request for Tracking Number form may be obtained from Carol Lorenzen (codywink@aol.com) The completed form is sent to Siouxsan Eisen at the address on the form, and the owner will be sent a tracking number to use for entering AHBA events. **In addition to using a consistent registration or tracking number, owners must use one consistent name when entering a dog.** After June 1, 2010, any incomplete recording form received by the AHBA will not be processed.

**LAST BUT NOT LEAST: COURTESY RULES**

**Poop & Scoop courtesy rules apply.** Lots of dogs and people frequent *Dog Tale Ranch*; we need to leave it as we find it. If you are in the yard, on the way to the trial area, around the arenas or in the arenas, please pick up after your dogs. If you are in a field or wildlife area, use your judgment – but if in doubt ... pick it up. There will be garbage pails around and pick-up bags for those who have forgotten them.

**Leashes.** Dogs must be on leash when in the trialing or yard areas and in proximity of stock or guardian dogs. This is a working ranch and the jobs of the “hands” must be respected.

**CAMPING & ACCOMMODATIONS BY DOG TALE RANCH**

Trial location is Dog Tale Ranch [www.ranching-with-sheep.com](http://www.ranching-with-sheep.com) Limited camping in the yard no hook ups. There will be a portable toilet and hand wash area in the yard.

There is a full campground facility at Manitou Beach, 35 km from the site. There are Bed & Breakfast and hotel accommodations at Manitou Beach. Check out <http://watrousmanitou.com/accom.htm>

**DIRECTIONS TO TRIAL LOCATION To Dog Tale Ranch from Saskatoon (this route has been rebuilt & is reliable in wet weather)**

Take highway 16 East to the junction of highway 2. Turn South (right) onto highway 2 and travel to Young. At Young, just past the grain elevator, turn West and cross the railroad tracks (your turn is the one with the railroad crossing arms). Follow the curves of this grid road (going west, curving south and then curving west again); travel 8 km (5 miles) from the tracks. Turn South (left) and travel 9.6 km (6 miles). Watch for a white church that will be on the driver's side of the road. At the white church, turn West (right) and travel 3.2 km (2 miles). Turn South and travel 1.6 km (1 mile) to the yard. **This route has half the gravel road travel but is 10 km longer than alternate route.**

**Alternate Route to Dog Tale Ranch from Saskatoon (please check with Jill if you plan on using this route – there was flooding earlier in year:**

Take Highway 11 South and travel to Hanley. About 1 km South of Hanley turn East (left) onto gravel (grid) road 764. Travel east on this grid for 35 km. Turn North (left) and travel 3.2 km. Turn East (right) and travel 1.6 km. Turn South (right) and travel 1.6 km into yard. The yard is located around a bend and tucked into trees so is not visible until you arrive. **This route involves 40 km of gravel road travel.**

**To Dog Tale Ranch from Highway 2 South**

Travel North on highway 2 up to Highway 15. Turn West (left) on highway 15. Travel 32.4 km going through two small valleys. Turn North (right, this turn is at the bottom of the second valley) and travel 12.5 km. Turn East (right) and travel about 1 km to first road going North again. Turn North (left) and travel 3.2 km. Turn East (right) and travel 1.6 km. Turn South (right) and travel 1.6 km into yard.

**To Dog Tale Ranch from Watrous, SK.**

Leave Watrous on highway 2 heading North. At the Co-op Agro Centre turn West (left) and cross the railroad tracks. Immediately turn North (right) and follow the curve back to the west again. Travel this grid road for 24 km (15 miles) until you reach a yield sign. At the yield sign, turn South (left) and travel 4.8 km (3 miles). Watch for a white church that will be on the driver's side of the road. At the white church, turn West (right) and travel 3.2 km (2 miles). Turn South and travel 1.6 km (1 mile) to the yard. **See map on last page**

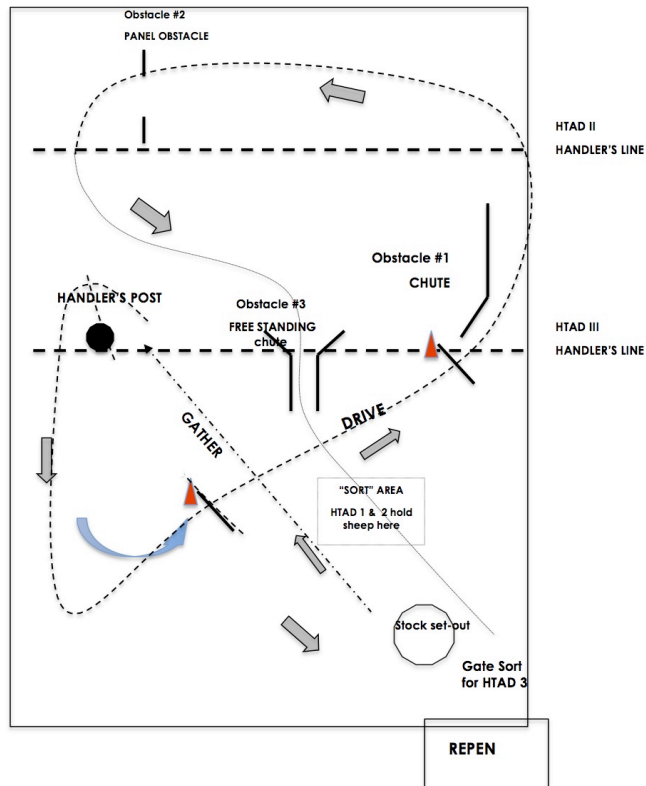

## HTAD Course Map for Trial A & B

Course 5 – gather & gate sort

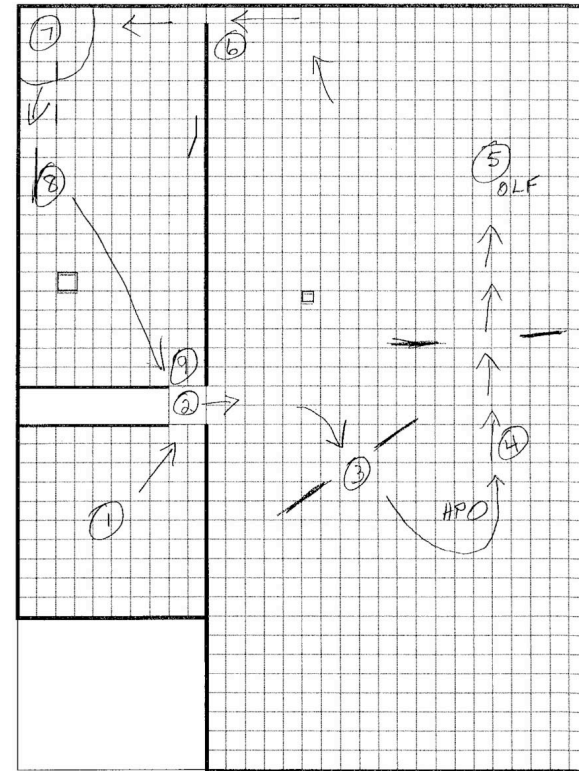
100 foot by 200 foot Arena



- Gather**– Sheep are let out & allowed to settle. All levels sheep are brought to and around the handler's post
- Drive** Sheep are taken South along fence to 30 feet from south fence, then toward pylon. Handlers at all levels may accompany sheep to this point. Sheep are driven to the chute (Obstacle 1) from the handler's post (pylon) to the entrance Obstacle 1. HTAD I, may drive, fetch, or a combination of the two; HTAD II, handler may accompany sheep for half distance, then sheep must be driven rest of distance; HTAD III, sheep will be driven the full minimum distance away from the handler
- Obstacle #1 (chute)** Sheep taken through obstacle 1. HTAD II and III handlers remain at the designated location (above) until sheep clear chute; HTAD I handlers remain at the entrance of the Y chute until the sheep clear it.
- Obstacle #2 (free standing panels)** none the handlers may go through the panels Sheep exit Obstacle 1 → HTAD I may fetch or drive the stock through Obstacle 2; HTAD II must stay on the post side of the handler's line; HTAD III will remain behind a handler's until sheep clear the obstacle obstacle.
- Obstacle #3 (free-standing chute)** Sheep are pushed through the free-standing chute.
- Gate Sort** Sheep taken to the sorting/hold area. HTAD I and II briefly hold the stock, then to the re-pen. HTAD III take sheep to fence line pen & sort 2 marked sheep into pen.
- Re-pen** HTAD I & II take sheep to the re-pen & hold them a short distance off gate while it is being opened, and then are re-penned. HTAD III following the gate sort, sheep that had been left out in the arena are re-penned.

## HRD Course Map & Description for Trial A & B

Using Arenas: 100X100 + 200X400 + 100X200 ft



Element # 1 - short gather in the small arena into the take pen, then dog and handler go through the take pen into the big field and close the gate (no need to latch it).

Element #2 – take pen into the big field.

Element #3 – through freestanding obstacle to handlers' post.

Element #4 – around handlers' post counter-clockwise and into the fetch/drive the required distance. For HRD I and II the distance will be 75 feet and will end before the freestanding obstacle. HRD III drive **MUST** drive through the freestanding obstacle, distance 120 feet.

Element # 5 – Outrun, lift, fetch back to the handlers' post

Element #6 – Shortest distance from handlers' post to top gate into arena

Element #7 – hold in the top left corner of the arena.

Element #8 – fenceline obstacle

Element #9 – re-pen for HRD I & II, sort for HRD III.
