Due to the anticipated large entry, the club is reserving a portion of the building for pre-assigned grooming spaces. Those exhibitors who are LISTED as EITHER THE OWNER OR THE HANDLER/AGENT on 6 or more dogs, or who are co-ordinating a group of individuals setting up together, may request that an area be reserved for them. Once the allotted area has been filled, all further requests will be returned as will any requests received after the close of entries. Requests will be acknowledged via email after the closing date and prior to the beginning of the show.

Please note: Exercise pens may be restricted to 1 pen per 3 entered dogs, depending on the size of the entry.

In addition to the pre-assigned areas, there will also be regular first come, first served grooming space in which equipment/dogs may be left for the duration of the shows. Ex-pens are permitted in this area.

There will also be an area that will be set aside for Day of Show grooming - this will be first come, first served and all equipment MUST BE REMOVED after Best in Show each night. There will be NO exercise pens allowed in this area.

Any equipment left after Best In Show will be removed by the club or one of it's delegates.

Grooming areas will be monitored by the club and delegated individuals - and exhibitors who do not keep their areas clean, or abuse the space allotted may be asked to leave the show.

*NO DOG MAY BE ENTERED IN BOTH NOVICE "A" & "B" AT SAME TRIAL.
NO DOG MAY BE ENTERED IN BOTH OPEN "A" & "B" AT SAME TRIAL*

RALLY NOVICE A: Dogs competing in this class may not have won a CKC Rally Novice (R.N.) title or any CKC Novice Obedience title. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class. However, a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has won the title.

RALLY NOVICE B: Any dog may compete in this class until a qualifying score in the Rally Advanced Class is earned. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged on leash, and all dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

RALLY ADVANCED A: This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Novice (R. N.) title but have not won the Rally Advanced (R. A.) title or any CKC Novice Obedience title. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class. However, a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has won the title.

RALLY ADVANCED B: This class will be for dogs that have won the Rally Novice (R.N.) title. A dog completing the Rally Advanced (R.A.) title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged off leash. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

RALLY EXCELLENT A: This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced (R. A.) title, but have not won the Rally Excellent (R. E.) title or any CKC Novice Obedience title. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class. However, a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has won the title.

RALLY EXCELLENT B: This class will be for dogs that have won the Rally Advanced (R.A.) title. A dog completing the Rally Excellent (R.E.) title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged off leash except the Honour Exercise. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

CONFORMATION CLASSIFICATIONS

The following official regular/non-regular classes (divided by sex) will be provided at this Specialty.

JUNIOR PUPPY - dogs 6 mths & under 9 mths on the day of this Show

SENIOR PUPPY - dogs 9 mths & under 12 mths on the day of this Show

12 to 18 MONTH CLASS - dogs 12 mths & under 18 mths on day of Show

CANADIAN BRED - dogs born in Canada, Champions of any country excluded

BRED BY EXHIBITOR - For dogs owned and handled in the ring by Breeder

OPEN CLASS - For all dogs (**Note: Divided by colour – Black or Landseer**)

VETERANS CLASS - For dogs 7 – 9 years of age and 9+ years of age and older

on the day of this Show. *Dogs entered in this class DO NOT COMPETE FOR*

POINTS but rather the winners each of the Veteran Male & Veteran Female

Class go directly onto the Best of Breed competition. (Note: Spayed or

neutered dogs may be entered in this class)

SPECIALS ONLY - For dogs that have earned all the Championship Points

required for CKC Championship status at the time of closing of entries

EXHIBITION ONLY - For dogs wishing to compete in a non-regular class. No

dog entered for Exhibition Only may compete in any of the Regular Classes

NON-REGULAR/UNOFFICIAL CLASSES

ALL DOGS MUST BE ENTERED IN ONE OF THE REGULAR CLASSES OR FOR EXHIBITION ONLY.

BRACE CLASS - This class shall be for two dogs of the same breed (not necessarily of the same sex) (*Note: effective January 1, 2006– identical ownership NO LONGER applies*)

STUD DOG CLASS – This class shall be comprised of the Stud Dog and 2 or more of his get. All dogs comprising the get need not be the property of the same exhibitor. Get must be entered in a regular class.

BROOD BITCH CLASS – This class shall be comprised of the Brood Bitch and 2 or more of her progeny. All dogs comprising the progeny need not be the property of the same exhibitor. Progeny must be entered in a regular class.

OBEDIENCE CLASSES: Unofficial

Refer to Section 15 of the O.T.R.&R. The rules are paraphrased below.

The following classes are offered at these Trials:

GRADUATE NOVICE CLASS - This class is open to all dogs that have not gained a qualifying score toward the “CDX” title in Canada BUT that has obtained the title “CD” in Canada prior to the closing of entries.

GRADUATE OPEN CLASS - This class is open to all dogs that have not obtained a qualifying score toward the “UD title in Canada BUT which has obtained the title “CDX” in Canada prior to the closing of entries.

VERSATILITY CLASS - This class is open to all dogs that have attained the title of “CDX” in Canada and at least 1 leg on the Utility title, or that has obtained the “UD” title in Canada prior to the closing of entries.

BRACE CLASS - This class is open to any two dogs of the same breed and of either sex, which have attained not less than a “CD” title in Canada. The same person NEED NOT own both dogs.

TEAM CLASS - This class is open to any four dogs of the same breed and of either sex, which have attained not less than a “CD” title in Canada. The same person NEED NOT own all four dogs.

VETERAN’S CLASS-is open to dogs that have an obedience title and are 7 years and older. Dogs entered in this class must also be entered in any Regular class or for Exhibition Only.

TRANSITION OBEDIENCE CLASSES

PRE-NOVICE – This class shall be for all purebred dogs and those breeds as designated on the list of miscellaneous breeds and of either sex, which have not earned the title of P.C.D. (Pre-Companion Dog) in Canada. Dogs being entered in this class may be handled or exhibited by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class and must have an additional handler for each dog when they are judged together on the Group exercise. A dog may be entered in the Pre-Novice that has not earned the title of C.D. in Canada or a comparable title in any other country. The Pre-Novice class is an elective class and earning a title is not a requirement to advance to the Novice Classes.

NOVICE “C” – This class is open to any dog of either sex that has gained the title Companion Dog, Companion Dog Excellent, Utility Dog or any other advanced Obedience title in Canada prior to the closing date of the trial in which it is to be entered. Exhibitors may enter more than one dog in this class but must have a separate handler for each dog in the Long Sit and the Long Down Exercises when they are judged in the same group. The Novice ‘C’ exercises will be performed and judged as described in the official Novice Class except that exhibitors may compete in the Novice ‘C’ Class indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs entered in the Novice ‘C’ Class are not eligible for High In Trial. The P.C.D. and C.D.I. and Novice ‘C’ are elective classes which are offered for those people who feel the dog requires ring experience and acclimation to the trial situation or would like to earn additional titles. Dogs may be entered in the Novice – Intermediate (C.D.I.) and/or Novice ‘C’ class in addition to any of the Official Classes or Unofficial Classes.

NOVICE INTERMEDIATE CLASS – This class shall be for all purebred dogs and those breeds as designated on the list of miscellaneous breeds and of either sex, which have earned the title of (C.D.) Companion Dog, Companion Dog Excellent, Utility Dog or any other advanced Obedience title in Canada. A dog eligible for entry in the Open A or B Class at any obedience trial held under these rules is also eligible for entry in the Novice ‘C’ and Novice Intermediate Class at the same trial. The Novice Intermediate class (C.D.I.) is an elective class and earning a title is not a requirement to advance to a Companion Dog Excellent title. Scores earned by dogs competing in this class are not eligible for High In Trial. Dogs are eligible to compete in this class indefinitely. Dogs in this class may be handled or exhibited by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

OBEDIENCE CLASSIFICATIONS

NO DOG MAY BE ENTERED IN BOTH NOVICE “A” & “B” AT SAME TRIAL

NO DOG MAY BE ENTERED IN BOTH OPEN “A” & “B” AT SAME TRIAL

NOVICE “A” - This class is open to all dogs, providing the dog has not earned the title of “CD” in ANY COUNTRY. **One dog ONLY may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor.** The exhibitor ***MUST BE THE OWNER*** or ***A MEMBER OF HIS/HER IMMEDIATE FAMILY*** and ***MUST SHOW THE DOG IN ALL EXERCISES.*** No licensed handler, trainer or any person who has previously exhibited a dog through its “UD” title in Canada or Elsewhere shall be allowed to compete in this class, but ***MUST COMPETE IN NOVICE “B” CLASS***

NOVICE “B” - This class is open to all dogs, which have not earned the title of “CD”, and may be shown by the owner or any other person. The dog may not necessarily be CKC or ERN Reg’d to compete in this class

OPEN “A” - This class is open to all dogs which have earned the title of “CD” IN CANADA, but have not earned the title of “CDX” in any country. **One dog ONLY may be entered in this class by any one exhibitor.** The exhibitor ***MUST BE THE OWNER*** or ***A MEMBER OF HIS/HER IMMEDIATE FAMILY*** and ***MUST SHOW THE DOG IN ALL EXERCISES.*** No licensed handler, trainer or any person who has previously exhibited a dog through its “UD” title in Canada or Elsewhere shall be allowed to compete, but ***MUST COMPETE IN THE OPEN “B” CLASS.*** A CKC or ERN Reg’d number must be provided on the entry form at time of closing of entries to be eligible to compete in this class

OPEN “B” - This class is open to all dogs, which have earned the title of “CD” in CANADA, and may be shown by the owner or any other person. This dog ***MAY ALSO COMPETE IN THE UTILITY CLASS.*** A CKC or ERN Reg’d number must be provided on the entry form at time of closing of entries to be eligible to compete in this class

UTILITY CLASS ‘A’ - This class is open to any dog of any recognized or listed breed which has earned the title of “CDX” but has not earned the title of U.D. Any person who has trained or exhibited a dog that has earned a M.O.T.Ch title may not handle dogs in this class..This dog must be shown by the owner or a member of their immediate families. A CKC or ERN Reg’d number must be provided on the entry form at time of closing of entries to be eligible to compete in this class. Owners may enter More than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises. When a dog is wrongfully entered in this class, any score will be cancelled.

UTILITY CLASS ‘B’ - This class is open to any dog of any recognized or listed breed which has earned the title of “CDX” or U.D. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person.A CKC or ERN Reg’d number must be provided on the entry form at time of closing of entries to be eligible to compete in this class. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises. No dog may be entered in both the Utility A and Utility B classes at any one trial. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will decide the order of exercises to be performed. This order will not be disclosed to exhibitors until it is posted at ringside, approx. 30 mins. Prior to the start of the class.

AGREEMENT

I (we) acknowledge that I (we), all exhibitors, handlers and patrons, know and abide by the "CKC Dog Show Rules", and that I am (we are) familiar with their content. I (we) agree that the Club holding this show has the right to refuse this entry for cause, which the Club shall deem to be sufficient. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of the Show and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prize money, ribbons or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the Auld Lang Syne Dog Association & Renaissance Dog Association, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents or show secretary and the owner or lessor of the premises and any employees of the aforementioned parties, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of a dog while in or upon the show premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim, and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss of a dog by disappearance, theft, death or otherwise, and from any claim for damage or injury to the dog, whether such loss, disappearance, theft, damage or injury be caused or alleged to be caused by the negligence of the Club or any of the parties aforementioned, or by the negligence of any other person, or any other cause or causes.

I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves), or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in this show, howsoever such injuries, death or damage to property may be caused and whether or not the same may have been caused and whether or not the same may have alleged to have been caused by negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees or agents, or any other person.
