DIRECTIONS TO TEST SITE

Travel West from Edmonton on Highway 16, (Yellowhead Hwy).

Exit North off Hwy 16, at the Wabamun town exit (also signed for Whitewoods Golf).

Head North 3kms on Range Road 41 to Twp. Rd. 534.

Head West on Twp. Rd. 534 for 3.3 kms.

Turn left onto the gravel road, our property is a small drive up the road, with the entrance on the right hand side.

if you reach Whitewoods you have gone about half a kilometer too far

GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. Copies of the Hunt Test Rules and Regulations are available from the Canadian Kennel Club, 5397 Eglinton Avenue W, Suite 101, Etobicoke, Ontario M9C 5K6. CKC Hunt Test rulebooks can be download here: CKC Hunt Test Rules and Regulations.
- 2. Entry is online <u>ONLY</u> at <u>dogshow.ca</u>. Owners are responsible for errors during the entry process. The Alberta Clipper Hunting Retriever Association does not assume any responsibility for incorrect information or errors on any entry form.
- 3. Post entries and/or day of entries will not be accepted.
- 4. A waitlist will be maintained for stakes that achieve the entry limit (contact test secretary to be placed on the waitlist). The waitlist will be used to fill stakes **until the closing date**. Post closing scratches **will not** be filled from the waitlist.
- 5. Entry fees will not be refunded after the closing date. Dogshow.ca service charges are non-refundable. In the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by a judge or barred from competition by action of the Test Committee or the Canadian Kennel Club, or because it has been entered incorrectly, or if it is impossible to open or complete the test, no refund of entry will be made.
- 6. Bitches in season shall not be eligible for entry and shall not be allowed on the test grounds. Entry and TCN fees paid for any dog withdrawn because of estrus, injury, illness or death shall be refunded in full. An appropriate veterinary certificate must be given to the Test Secretary BEFORE the start of the test to qualify for a refund.
- 7. Running order will be determined by random selection. Running order will be available after 8:00 P.M. on Wednesday June 28, 2023
- 8. Printed catalogues will **NOT** be provided. Official catalogues will be emailed to handlers one day before the test. Please print the catalogue if you wish for your own use. Printed running orders for each stake will be provided. Each Marshall as well as the Test Secretary will have a catalogue to view.
- 9. Ducks and pheasants may be used in all stakes. Wingers may be used in any stake. Upland game will be used for the upland hunting tests in the Senior and Master Hunt Stakes.
- 10. Tests will be run at separate locations.
- 11. All throwers, Judges, competitors, and gallery members must wear dark or camouflaged clothing.
- 12. Any dog not appearing within 15 minutes of being called to the line by the Marshall may be disqualified.
- 13. Temporary Competition Number (TCN): Owners of unregistered CKC recognized breeds entering events are required to obtain a Temporary Competition Number (TCN). A TCN allows dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN). Dogs not registered in Canada must obtain a TCN before submitting an entry for a hunt test. A TCN fee of \$10.50 (includes GST) must be included with your entry fees. CKC Registration or ERN must be applied for within 30 days of the hunt test or all awards will be cancelled. TCN forms can be found on the Canadian Kennel Club website www.ckc.ca (under Forms tab/Shows & Trials/Exhibitors) (TNC) Application Form.
- 14. A CKC Non-Member Participation Fee applies to dogs wholly owned by a resident of Canada who is not a member of the CKC; it is not applicable to CKC members or dogs co-owned with a CKC member. In order for a CKC title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the Non-Member Participation Fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in the title being withheld and the dog cannot be moved up to the next level. CKC membership applications can be found on the Canadian Kennel Club website www.ckc.ca (under CKC Services and Forms online). Alternatively, individuals may complete the non-member participation fee form.
- 15. The Alberta Clipper Hunting Retriever Association and its members will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, BUT will not be responsible for, nor assume any liability in the event of an accident, injury or other misfortune to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons. Release and Indemnification below.
- 16. Electric Collars (either dummy or live) as well as prong or pinch type collars shall not be worn by any dog on the test grounds at any time during the event.
- 17. There shall be no training of dogs on the test grounds, except for single training bumpers, which are thrown by hand by the trainer, within 24 hours of the commencement of the event or anytime during the event.
- 18. All qualifying dogs will receive a rosette.
- 19. ACHRA reserves the rights to substitute and/or replace judges due to circumstances beyond its control.
- 20. Alcoholic beverages are NOT ALLOWED on the test grounds while tests are in progress!

RULE 20.7 of the Hunt Test Rules and Regulations states: "It shall be the duty and obligation of the event-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at a hunt test held under these regulations, is not subject to any indignities. The Hunt Test Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred."

RELEASE AND INDEMNIFICATION

By entering this Test (as handler, spectator or in any other capacity) each participant agrees to assume all risks and hazards incidental to these Tests and agrees to release and to save harmless and indemnify the Alberta Clipper Hunting Retriever Association and its members, any volunteer and the owner(s) and/or leasee(s) of any property upon which the Test may be held together with their officers, agents, employees and representatives from all claims, actions, costs, expenses and demands in respect to death, injury, loss or damage to the person or property of the participant howsoever caused, arising out of or in connection with the participants use or entry upon the property. It is understood that this agreement is binding upon the participants, his or her heirs, executors and assigns.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

Any person participating in any capacity at a Hunt Test or Working Certificate Test held under the CKC rules and regulations shall not be subjected to any indignity of any kind during the progress of the tests and it shall be the duty and obligation of the Alberta Clipper Hunting Retriever Association to see that this rule is effectively carried out. On report to the Alberta Clipper Hunting Retriever Association of an alleged indignity of any kind the Test Chairman will report the infringement to the CKC and the Test Committee shall forthwith conduct an investigation and shall have the power to take action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this rule has been violated.

No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of an event if it:

- Is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough, or other communicable disease.
- Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough, or other communicable disease within the 30 days prior to the event.
- Has been housed, in the 30 days prior to the event, on a premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough, or other communicable disease.

Clubs do have the right to remove a dog from the event premises and the exhibitor may be subject to disciplinary action if it is found that CKC rules have been contravened.
